The CVVFA/Emergency Responder Safety Institute is launching an ambitious project to make drivers aware of the the dangers distracted driving poses to emergency responders as they work on the roadway helping others. The project that is funded in part by a Fire Prevention and Firefighter Safety Grant from the Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program will focus on informing drivers who stop at visitor centers and rest stops along the nation's roadways. CVVFA Visitor Center Education Campaign Expands To Maryland

The CVVFA Emergency Responder Safety Institute Motorist Education Campaign expanded in Maryland with a display at the Sideling Hill Visitor Center on I-68. Bob Cumberland, CVVFA Past President announced that the visitor center has made available a display case that features information on Slow Down Move Over and the CVVFA Responder Safety Message. The Westminster MD Police Department contributed items for the display. Past President Cumberland is the Chairman of the CVVFA Highway Visitor Center Task Force. He and his team are working to expand the successful motorist information campaign founded in Pennsylvania to other states. Currently the CVVFA is preparing information to be distributed through ResponderSafety.com for educators and public information officers. A portion of this activity is funded by the FEMA Fire Prevention and Firefighter Safety Grant program.

CVVFA Receives FEMA Fire Prevention and Safety Grant For Responder Safety Project



The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) announced today that the CVVFA was awarded a Fire Prevention and Firefighter Safety Grant for \$429,048 to continue its work on protecting emergency responders on the highways. The grant funds ResponderSafety.com and the ResponderSafety Learning Network the world's largest repository of information to protect firefighters and other roadway responders from injury as they work to help others during traffic incidents. The grant will support new direct delivery materials and on line individual training all delivered though the ResponderSafety.com platforms.

The grant also will provide funds for the second phase of an aggressive Public Education campaign to inform motorists how distracted and careless drivers place responders in peril while they work highway emergency scenes. The campaign aims to change driver behavior.

"We are elated that we can continue our life safety work on the highways" said Steve Austin, Project Manager of the CVVFA/Emergency Responder Safety Institute. "Our team has been working for over 18 years along with many valued partners in the fire service, law enforcement, the towing and recovery industry and public works to educate, inform and advocate on behalf of all those who risk their lives working to help others during traffic incidents. We could not provide our services without the FEMA Assistance to Firefighter Grant Program" he added.

Presentations were given on the various topics including a proposed traffic management training center in Pennsylvania but Todd Leiss of the PA Turnpike Commission.

The Association approved a new Scholarship for students of OK State University Fire Engineering Program for a student to assist with research for the CVVFA Emergency Responder Safety Institute.

Meeting dates and locations were selected to 2017-2018 and are posted in events section of this site.

Congressman Bill Shuster, Chairman of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee who represents the McConnellsburg area stopped by the annual picnic to meet the out of state guests and to hear about the CVVFA's Responder Safety Institute.

The Presidents Council meeting was attended by the States of PA, WV, DE, MD, NJ as well as representatives from the Congressional Fire Services Institute, International Association of Fire Chiefs and the National Volunteer Fire Council.
