ABOUT THE PROGRAM

What You Do Matters is an interactive ethical leadership program developed by historians at the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum alongside career law enforcement practitioners. Through the history of how police and prosecutors made choices during 1933–1942, the program invites today's justice professionals to reflect on ethical leadership, the responsibilities of public service, and the weight of the decisions they make every day.

This September, the Association of Prosecuting Attorneys and the WYDM Institute will bring this training to a small group of prosecutors and justice professionals in Washington, DC. We are seeking partners to help make it possible.

HOW YOUR SUPPORT HELPS
