With 52 years of experience, Mr. Westrick has a long and distinguished career in the civil engineering field. As a design/construction engineer with the Road Commission of Macomb County for 10 years, Bill then joined Anderson, Eckstein and Westrick, Inc. (AEW) in 1972 as a principal owner. He was instrumental in implementing the Total Quality Management (TQM) program for the continuous improvement of the company, relative to the goal of outstanding service delivery. He was also the promoter of AEW ACEC projects; specifically he promoted and performed several ACEC endeavors over the years including elementary and high school education projects such as Science Olympiad projects and meeting with students to discuss opportunities in the Civil Engineering profession. In addition, he is a friend of the Metroparks and promotes and sponsors projects at Stony Creek, Wolcott Mill, and Wolcott Farms.
