TRANSPORTATION

CDOT - BRT & TCS

Wednesday, May 7, 2025



At the May 7 Chamber Transportation meeting, Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) Region1 Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Program Manager Ryan Noles gave an update on the project to implement BRT on Colorado Blvd., between

40th Ave and Yale Ave. Proposed concepts are being refined and screened with selection of preferred alternative planned by early fall 2025. Options being considered are 1/2 to 1/3 mile spacing between stations, and either center-running, side-running, or mixed flow

BRT lanes. No expansion of Colorado Blvd is anticipated because of the impact that it would have on property owners and on the bridges over I-25 and Cherry Creek Drive.

The analysis also includes the potential addition of bicycle infrastructure through the corridor. CDOT Transit Planner Goerge Gromke presented about a Transit Connections Study (TCS) currently being conducted by CDOT to create a

strategic vision for an integrated statewide transit network.

An analysis of "gaps" between existing and desired transit service has been completed, and efforts are currently identifying types of projects needed to create the desired state. Types of projects include new or extended corridors or service, frequency or schedule changes on existing services, and additions of stops or stations.

The final report and recommendations are anticipated to be available June 2025.

Arapahoe County Updates Wednesday, June 4, 2025



Director of Public Works and Development, Bryan Weimer, delivered his annual update-

an engaging and informative presentation on the County's transportation priorities, budget outlook, and infrastructure asset

Weimer thanked voters for approving Ballot Initiative 1A last fall, which provides new funding for essential services. The County is currently determining how to allocate these funds. However, Weimer noted that even if all 1A funds were directed to Public Works and Development, they would still fall short of what is needed to maintain the County's assets at the desired level.

To bridge this gap, the County will continue to leverage funding from multiple sources and build partnerships with local, state, and federal agencies. One major source is

the Denver Regional Council of Governments

(DRCOG), from which Arapahoe County is set to receive \$494.8 million through the 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Following Weimer's remarks, Transportation Division Manager Jim Katzer provided updates on several

transportation projects currently in progress:

- Dry Creek and Inverness Drive West: Scheduled for completion this month
- High Plains Trail (east of Parker Road): Construction begins later this summer
- Watkins Road and CR 38: Ongoing repairs and flood mitigation throughout the summer
- High Line Canal Underpass at Broadway: Design phase underway
- Parker Road Corridor Improvements: Final recommendations expected this fall

Together, these efforts reflect Arapahoe County's proactive approach to meeting current and future transportation needs.
