

### NEW NEUROETHOLOGY GORDON CONFERENCE

The first in a new series of triennial Gordon Research Conferences (GRCs), entitled *NEUROETHOLOGY: BEHAVIOR, EVOLUTION AND NEUROBIOLOGY*, will take place on 29 August to 3 September 1999 at Queen's College of Oxford University.

There will also be a poster session for other conferees to present their work. Because of their discussion-intensive format, all GRCs are limited to 130-150 participants.
