To obtain a Nursing Home Administrator License in the state of Illinois, candidates must pass both the national examination of the National Association of Boards of Examiners for Nursing Home Administrators (NAB Exam) and the Illinois Supplemental Jurisdictional Exam. This review course was specifically designed to help candidates prepare for and pass their examinations and is offered **each quarter** prior to the test dates for the Illinois Supplemental Jurisdictional Exam and the NAB Exams. This virtual program is conducted using the Webex platform.

DAY 1

Day 1 of this course will focus solely on material covered on the NAB Exam. The session will cover federal laws and regulations, and present basic principles of leadership and management, human resources, finance, and physical environment, as well as resident care and quality of life.

DAY 2

Day 2 will focus on materials covered on the state supplemental exam, primarily the Illinois licensing rules for skilled nursing facilities.

Study materials for this course will be provided to you <u>via Dropbox</u>. Several days prior to the event, registrants will receive an email from IHCA with information on how to join the virtual sessions and how to access their review materials. Registrants will only receive this information if their registration is complete and registration fees are paid. Registrants will also receive meeting invites via Webex and emails from Dropbox giving them access to the folders containing the review guides and other materials that will assist them in preparing for their examinations. These guides include the Illinois Department of Public Health Rules and Regulations for Skilled Nursing and Intermediate Care Facilities, information on the Medicare and Medicaid programs and federal survey protocols and guidance, federal employment laws and the Life Safety Code and more.

Objectives

To prepare participants to pass the Illinois Licensure Examination for Nursing Home Administrators through:

- Intensive lectures on basic principles of nursing home administration;
- ◆ Spotlighting and explanation of the "testable" provisions of the Illinois Minimum Standards; and
- Concentrated review of state and federal regulations that govern licensed nursing facilities and other important guidance regarding the operation of a nursing home.

Continuing Education

Illinois nursing home administrators, social workers, and licensed nurses who attend this course will earn 8.5 CEs for Day 1 and 7.5 CEs for Day 2. The Illinois Health Care Association is an approved sponsor of continuing education by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation.

Presenter

Michelle Stuercke is the Chief Clinical Officer for Transitional Care Management. She has more than 30 years of experience in long term and post-acute care and has served in a variety of roles during her career, including nurse, DON, Clinical Educator and Chief Nursing Officer. She holds several degrees, including a BSN, MSN, MPH and DNP.

Exam Application

The NHA licensing exam has two parts, a national exam and a state supplemental exam. Unless you have already passed the national exam in another state, you must register for and pass both of these exams in order to receive an Illinois license.

The national exam (the NAB exam) has two computer-based components, a 125-question CORE exam and a 75-question Line of Service (NHA) exam. Both components are usually taken together on a date scheduled by the candidate and at the candidate's choice of any one of 300 PSI Test Centers located throughout the nation, including nine sites in Illinois.

The State Supplemental exam is a 75-question pencil-and-paper exam that can only be taken on a certain date once each quarter (January, April, July or October). The exam site alternates between Springfield and the Chicago area.

Start your application process by visiting the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation's website (www.idfpr.illinois.gov). Click on "About IDFPR" then "Regulated Professions & Industries." Choose "G through N," then "Nursing Home Administrator." Here you will be able to access links to a candidate's study guide and both paper and online forms for the application for licensure and the exam.
