Honoring the Memory of Dr. Jim D. Webb, 1933-2022

- Whereas:** Dr. Jim Webb was a member of the Northwest component of the Edward H. Angle Society of Orthodontists; and
- Whereas:** We have learned with profound regret and sense of loss, of his death at the age of 89; and
- Whereas:** Dr. Webb was born to Percy and Maxine Webb in Roseburg, Oregon on March 13, 1933; and
- Whereas:** Jim met his future wife Helen at Oregon State University, and they were married on September 18, 1955, just before he entered OHSU School of Dentistry. After graduating from the School of Dentistry he served three years in the US Public Health Services as a dentist in Norfolk, Virginia, and in San Diego; and
- Whereas:** Dr. Webb graduated from St. Louis University as an Orthodontist in 1964 and moved to Portland Oregon. There he joined the Portland Orthodontic Group and its three founding members Denton J. (Denny) Reese, Guy A. Woods, Jr., and Eugene F. (Gene) Butori. In 1967 it became a five-doctor practice when Antone E. (Tony) Grosso joined their numbers. One of the practice's primary treatment focuses was the attention to detail with the edgewise appliance utilizing the concepts of Dr. Charles H Tweed. One of the unique features of the practice was weekly diagnosis and treatment planning sessions during which all doctors participated using patient records gathered during the prior week. With permission from the patients and or parents, all doctors could participate in the treatment of each patient as well. One major benefit of this approach for both patients and doctors was not needing to worry about treatment progress in the event of a doctor's absence while attending meetings, continuing education courses, illnesses and alike; and
- Whereas:** Jim, and all of the associates were Diplomates of the American Board of Orthodontics and sincerely enjoyed their membership in the Edward H. Angle Society of Orthodontics; and
- Whereas:** Dr. Webb loved Jesus; his faith was important, and he spent much of his time studying God's word. He served for many years at Valley Presbyterian Church as an Elder, and a Sunday School teacher. He was a member of the Kiwanis Camp for handicapped children; and
- Whereas:** Jim enjoyed hunting and fishing, especially his time spent annually in elk hunting camp. He was a proud supporter of the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation. As an avid outdoorsman he also enjoyed hiking and volunteered to be responsible for maintaining five miles of the Pacific Crest Trail. At home he enjoyed landscaping his yard and harvesting from his bountiful garden. He was a kind generous soul, and he will be greatly missed; and
- Whereas:** Jim is survived by his lovely wife, Helen, his beautiful four children, Pam Webb, Daniel Webb (Debra), Janet Scarth (David), Paul Webb (Shay), and his much loved ten grandchildren and five great grandchildren; and
