PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

To My Respected Colleagues,

"These are the times that try men's souls. The summer soldier and the sunshine patriot will, in this crisis, shrink from the service of their country; but he that stands by it now, deserves the love and thanks of man and woman."

Thomas Paine, *The Crisis*; Philadelphia;
December 23, 1776.

Almost two and a half centuries ago, Thomas Paine penned these words to inspire and invigorate the American colonies to seek independence. He used common language to cultivate the commitment to the community, to each other. As our own generation faces our unique adversity—a challenge of unknown strength, magnitude and persistence which could also potentially lead to domination—are we in a similar place as Paine's 18th century Philadelphia?

We, too, share compassion for those who suffer by sacrifice, marked by loss of family, reduction of income, and possible uncertainty in future employment...

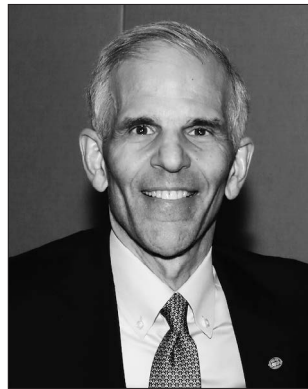
We, too, scorn the selfish, self-serving who lack the consideration of our greater community; some by preying upon us to seek greedy profit from the sale of supplies essential to meeting this

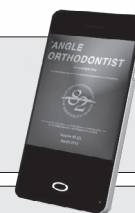

Who was Dr. George Hahn?

Dr. Hahn graduated from the Angle School in Pasadena in 1922 and along with Drs Spencer Atkinson and Cecil Steiner he became mainstays of Angle's teaching staff. In 1925, he joined the faculty of the University of California and taught orthodontics for the rest of his career. He was a charter member of the 1930 rebirth and reorganization of the Edward H. Angle Society of Orthodontia. He became treasurer of the society in 1938 until 1953 when he became Secretary.

2021 Angle East Meeting

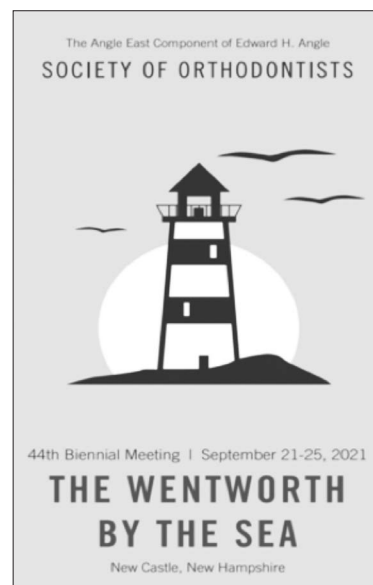
The 2021 Angle East annual meeting will be held at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel in Chicago, IL from Friday, March 26, 2021 to Sunday,

Joint Angle East/Angle Society of Europe Webinars

As we all know, the COVID-19 virus has affected us all in multiple ways. Aside from the risks to health and the vast impact to the world's economy, the crisis has disrupted the education of those who are completing dental specialty programs. To mitigate this problem, Angle East (AE) and the Angle Society of Europe (ASE) have started to present an ongoing series of lectures for simultaneous viewing by the orthodontic residents throughout the world. The initiative was initiated by Ute Schneider-Moser of AE and Renato Cocconi of ASE. The project has enlisted many of our component's and ASE's members to provide one-hour lectures on pertinent clinical topics, followed by a one-half hour question-and-answer period. Virtual technology has been indispensable for presenting these lectures four times per week since late March. The shelter-at-home requirement has permitted the participation of over 300 graduate programs from throughout

the world. As a non-profit, sponsor-free initiative intended to both educate and create collaboration among the global community, the Angle Society has realized absolutely no gain with exception of educational enrichment for the residents.

The webinars have been so well received that we plan to continue this effort even after the COVID-19 crisis is resolved. Our intent is to offer the same format twice per month without cost to the graduate programs. Residents in Europe will view the webinars in the evening while the U.S. East Coast views them at lunchtime. The American West Coast can see them at the start of their day. Residents of other continents can simultaneously utilize this service in live format with the exception of Asia, where the time delay will necessitate recorded viewing soon after the original presentation. Alternatively, or a second live presentation within 24 hours can be provided depending on the disposition of the speaker.

This is an ideal way to promote the Angle Society and to inspire and motivate deserving young orthodontists to join our wonderful group. There have already been residents that have approached us with the desire to join Angle East. These are the true "crème de la crème" individuals who are strongly interested in pursuing orthodontic excellence and to uphold the Angle legacy in the future.

Again, there has been no profit motive nor commercial sponsorship involved with this global initiative and it should be kept as such. The intent is solely to contribute to the educational experience of our world's residents in a manner parallel to/complementary with the academic community, and to exhibit the spirit that makes the Angle Society "The Ultimate Study Club."

practiced orthodontics in Largo for another three decades.

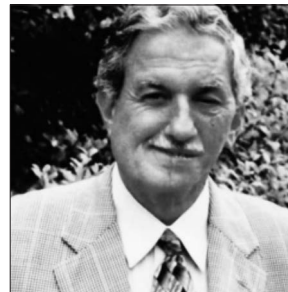
Upon retirement, Dick moved to Bamberg, Germany where he provided orthodontic care to U.S. troops stationed there. Dick was known for his keen intelligence and high ethical standards, earning a place in the Eastern Component of the Angle Society as president from 1978 to 1979.

Harry S. Galblum, passed away peacefully at his home in Bethesda, Maryland at the age of 98 on May 8, 2019. He was surrounded by family and friends who loved him while overlooking his beautiful garden. A pioneering orthodontist in the Washington area, Harry taught at Howard University's College of Dentistry and was a veteran of World War II.



In 1967, Harry formed an orthodontic laboratory, Dental Corporation of America (DCA) with another Angle East member, Harold Eskew. This lab originally started to serve the needs of the greater Washington metropolitan area but grew exponentially. It was an orthodontic lab specializing in removable appliances as well as custom made orthodontic bands (before direct bonding). They sold it in 1975.

Harry was an innovative leader in orthodontics, being one of the first to develop the open clinical treatment area, which has become the standard for the specialty. Also, he was one of the first orthodontists in utilizing the expanded duties of orthodontic assistants. A Diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics, he served as Angle East's president in 1974-75. Harry was involved in the Millennium Society and the Schulman Study Group, two early management groups.



Dr. Vincent DeAngelis passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his loving family on November 22, 2019. He leaves his legacy and five generations of Harvard-trained orthodontics Fellows globally.

Dr. DeAngelis had been an active player in local and national orthodontic and dental associations, serving in various capacities including president of Angle East, the Northeastern Society of Orthodontists, and the Massachusetts Society of Orthodontics. He earned various distinguished awards, accolades, and textbook dedications over his illustrious career. Moreover, the Harvard Society for the Advancement of Orthodontics honored him in 2002 by naming "The Vincent DeAngelis Education Award" for deserving educators.

Edward Miller, a former past president of Angle East from 1988 to 1989, passed away in Fort Myers, Florida. He had moved to Florida to enjoy his retirement. Ed was a talented orthodontist who established Andover Orthodontics in 1959. A beloved mentor to many Tufts students, many of whom are Anglers, he was recipient of the Tufts Dental Medicine Alumni Award in 1987. Ed greatly contributed to the advancement of orthodontics and to organized dentistry. ■

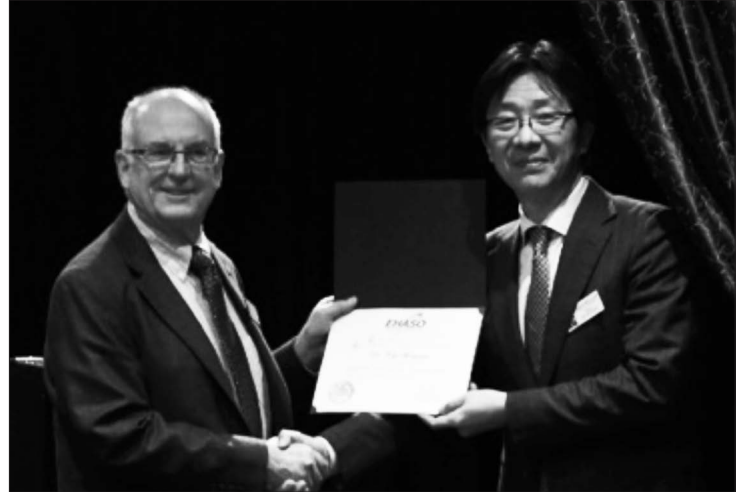

Dr. John Charles Dumars

June 17, 1938 - November 14, 2019

It is with great sorrow that we announce the passing of Dr. John Dumars. He suffered a tragic fall and passed peacefully surrounded by his wife, children, grandchildren and friends at Queen of the Valley Hospital in Napa, California on November 14, 2019.

John was born on June 17, 1938 in Woodland, CA to John Courtney and Clarabelle Amelia Dumars. At the age of 7, he moved to Ord Bend, CA and subsequently moved to Chico where he graduated from high school in 1956. He attended UC Berkeley as an undergraduate and then matriculated at Loyola School of Dentistry where he graduated as valedictorian in 1963. He served in the Navy as a dentist assigned to the Marine Corps Camp Pendleton. After his service to our country, he fulfilled his lifelong career aspiration and attended the top ranked orthodontic residency at the University of Washington, Seattle.

His PORG friends would attest that John was always the one who selected the wine at dinner, albeit for two or twenty couples, and it was predictably excellent. Naturally he enjoyed fine wine and was generous in sharing the best with his friends, with appreciation for giving others the pleasure that he received from Napa's finest. He was warm and engaging, soft spoken and beloved by so many. Rarely could he be seen without his huge, somewhat mischievous smile that

immediately made you feel comfortable and welcome. He possessed a keen wit, superb intelligence, subdued sense of humor and was the consummate gentleman. All of these attributes came easily to John.

John also served a term as president of the Napa Solano Dental Society, was a past Editor of the Journal of Orthodontics and was a member in numerous additional professional organizations. He belonged to several fraternal and service organizations including the Elks Club, and Napa Rotary. He served as president of the Justin-Siena Foundation and counted numerous friends in the Table 31, Dental Winetasters, and Napa Valley Winetasters.

John enjoyed traveling and loved fishing, especially saltwater fishing. He made annual trips to the east cape of Baja and also fished Alaska, Central and South America. He went for the catch, but also for the adventure. He and Pat traveled extensively with trips to Europe, New Zealand, Australia and Asia. In retirement many of those travels were with special friends from his study club, Bob and Carol Hortin. He was a lifelong and avid fan of the San Francisco Giants and 49ers. Tailgating with John and Pat at 49ers games was a celebration and feast not to be missed.

John lived life to its fullest enjoying family, friends, travel, and career. He revered life as "such a joy," his only regret being that he "couldn't do it all over again." John was rarely angry at anything, save an overdone steak and regularly enjoyed the restaurants and wines of his beloved Napa Valley.

He is survived by his wife, Patricia and their children, Mark of Napa, Susan (Hollis Hugar) of Dixon, Michael (Kimberly) of Modesto, and Ken of Napa. In addition, he is survived by his 5 grandchildren, Michael Courtney, Adele Marie, Renee Elizabeth, Justin Joseph, and Margaret Grace and multiple nieces and nephews. He is preceded in death by his parents, John and Clarabelle, and sister, Linda (Arthur) Smithson.
