PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic. On this anniversary it is clear many things in our lives and practice have been permanently changed by the events of the last two years. The level of stress, uncertainty and

general chaos that was a part of the early days has begun to subside. As things return to the "new normal" we should be proud of the great resilience we have shown despite the challenges. As we look to the future and what we can achieve in 2022 and 2023 the Board is working behind the scenes to make some needed changes

Several members have inquired as to whether Angle Society CE credits are approved by licensing jurisdictions that mandate continuing education for the maintenance of dental licensure. The short answer is "maybe" depending on the state in which you practice. California has strictly worded requirements and accepts

only certified credits. Arizona, on the other hand, accepts any "dental-related instruction sponsored by a national, state, or local dental, dental hygiene, or denturist association" with no requirement for certification. This situation has created confusion for our members, and in some situations prevented them from submitting Angle credits for re-certification.

The two primary entities in the United States that provide dental regulatory agencies with a recognized, uniform basis for acceptance of CE credits are ADA CERP Recognition and the AGD PACE Program. Currently, the National Society does not possess certification from either of these agencies.

I will make it a priority to rectify this situation. Dr. Bhavna Shroff Angle North Atlantic Director and Secretary and Angle North Atlantic Director Scott Conley have been instrumental in my understanding of the certification process and connecting me with

Angle East Director Dr. David Briss.

Dr Briss is Associate Professor at Rutgers School of Dental Medicine and Coordinating Editor of Practical Reviews in Orthodontics. He has graciously agreed to complete the application and provide documentation for PACE Certification. Any of the Components who have undertaken this process on their own can testify to the volume and complexity of the process. We are all indebted to Dr. Briss for his efforts on behalf of the organization.

During our next Board meeting I will make a motion to create the position of National

Director of Continuing Education Certification and to appoint Dr. Briss as the first Director. Details remain to be worked out, but as currently envisioned each Component will need to elect or appoint a Component CE Compliance Officer who will be responsible for documenting and retaining copies of Component course goals, objectives, evaluations, roster submissions, mailing of meeting notices and certificates, etc.

My sincere thanks to all who are working so hard to bring certification to our society and streamline the process of submitting CE credits. ■




Dr. Laura Iwasaki gave a lecture on "Use of mechanobehavior scores to predict TMJ growth and degeneration".




Meeting News:

The January 2022 NCAS Scientific Program was dedicated to the late Dr. George Kaprelian.




The continued virtual meeting format has made it easier for resident attendance at NCAS meetings.






Lunch was provided remotely to the January 2022 NCAS meeting attendees, and it definitely brought smiles.







friendship and love of Angle Society excellence in orthodontics!



Therefore, our featured speaker for this year's 2022 Spring 3-Day Scientific Meeting was **Tung Nguyen, DMD, MS** from UNC Chapel Hill.

A Brief Synopsis of the Angle Southern California 2022 Spring 3-Day Scientific Meeting:

Friday, March 25th

All Affiliate and Regular Members are required to bring 2 completed cases each year with full beginning, progress if available and ending records. The cases are displayed on tables so that the membership and guests can review and have the opportunity to discuss the cases with the presenters. The cases are to be written up with beginning, progress and ending models, photos, radiographs, tracings, and other pertinent information. This requirement is in harmony with Edward H. Angle's belief that an Orthodontic Study Club is very beneficial for the sharing of diagnostic skills as well as clinical treatment skills. All can learn from each other. Putting the 'Plaster on the Table' and the sharing of one's diagnostic and clinical skills is a portion of the 3-Day Scientific Meeting that is always looked forward to by all of the membership as well as by the Orthodontic Residents that attend the meeting from USC, UCLA and LLU.

The current Membership Requirements to Angle Southern California require 2 completed cases for Affiliate Membership and









an additional 10 completed cases for Regular Membership. A candidate for Affiliate and subsequently Regular Membership can attain this goal by bringing 2 cases per year for a period of 6 years. A Regular Member Sponsor is assigned to someone desiring membership in Angle Southern California. There is also a Case Report presentation and a publication requirement for Regular Membership. Consequently, the Friday session is usually replete with many membership presentations that cover very interesting technical, diagnostic, clinical and Case Report presentations.

Dr. Nguyen has over 70 publications and book chapters and has lectured nationally and internationally. His research interests are 3D imaging, 3D printing and dentofacial orthopedics.




