# At a crossroads: We Must Push on to Continued Prosperity!

It has been a few years since I took my driver's education training and I suspect the same is true for everyone else. At the time of my driver's test, there was a theoretical and nearly impossible situation that is proposed to the test

taker. If a fire truck, police car, ambulance, and postal vehicle each arrive at a four way stop at the same exact moment, who has the right of way?

As you ponder this question, several important initiatives the board oversaw this past year are found below.

## 1. EH Angle Society dues and membership rolls:

Several ongoing challenges with both our membership dues collection and accuracy of the membership rolls have been ongoing both

before and since COVID closures. COVID caused many practices to decline with some parts of our global orthodontic community being more affected than others. There was a notable short-term bounce back; however, according to data from Gaidge many practices have seen a decline over the past three years. Additional challenges surrounded the accuracy of the membership rolls which unfortunately led to some members unintentionally not receiving dues statements and the central office not having the ability to contact members. Pairing the two led to a very significant "lost revenue" of \$170,000 to the society and the foundation.

Through the hard work of each of the component directors, Chris Lapine of Knowledge Works Global (formerly Allen Press), and Dr. Bhavna Shroff our secretary, the campaign to recoup delinquent dues was highly successful collecting all but \$25,000.



Our dues represent a small portion from each of our practices or academic work settings yet they go to support our core mission of advancing the art and

science of orthodontics. The dues have a "force multiplier effect" by allowing us to not only publish The Angle Orthodontist, for our membership, but also make the journal open access making the information accessible to anyone who wishes to read it. If someone can access the internet, they can access our journal. Doing so has elevated the standard of orthodontics globally. Other more recent efforts include our support of Angle Net a huge positive that resulted from the COVID shutdowns. The Board enthusiastically supports the work of Angle Net which reaches practices and universities across the globe.

Both the Angle Orthodontist and Angle Net help our society and foundation accomplish its mission and enlarges our impact on global orthodontics.



Through the generosity of many of our members, the AAOF, and other strategic partners, the vision that was launched in 2005 achieved its initial funding goal in 2021. It continues to receive donations and the investments provide additional capital to the fund. A tremendous thank you for all our donors and especially those who give on a continual basis.

So, back to our four-way stop; who has the right of way? While hard to believe it is the postal vehicle! Remember the inscription above the New York City Post Office: "neither snow nor rain nor heat nor gloom of night stays these couriers from the swift completion of their appointed rounds."


