CERTIFICATION

The City's **Certification program** serves as a **vehicle** for small disadvantaged, minority and women-owned businesses to pursue opportunities with the city.

Certification is not required to do business but is **highly encourage** if a small business would like to do business with the city.



WHY SHOULD MY BUSINESS BECOME CERTIFIED?



DSBO FOUNDATION / *GOVERNANCE*

- The City and County of Denver is a recipient of local funding. As a condition of local funding, DSBO is responsible for implementing all aspects of the Professional Service/Construction Ordinance, and the Goods & Services Ordinance. All are re-authorized at five-year intervals. In addition, DSBO's authority is created by Executive Order,
 - The <u>Professional Service/Construction</u> Ordinance is found in D.R.M.C. Chapter 28 Article III; the <u>Goods & Services</u> Ordinance in Article V; and <u>Small Business Enterprise</u> in Article VII.
 - The purpose of D.R.M.C Chapter 28 Article III, V, and VII is to enable the city, through its departments and agencies, to <u>undertake specific activities to promote equity, maximize</u> <u>opportunities and prevent discrimination and its effects against business enterprises that have</u> <u>been certified as M/WBEs AND SBEs.</u>





- The City and County of Denver is a direct recipient of federal financial assistance from the U.S.
 Department of Transportation. As a condition of receiving federal assistance, DSBO is responsible for implementing all aspects of the DBE program in accordance with the 49 CFR Part 26.
 - The purpose of the USDOT 49 CFR Part 26 is to enable the city to <u>ensure nondiscrimination</u>, create a level playing field, narrow tailoring, ensure firms meet the eligibility standards, help remove barriers and assist in the development of firms to compete successfully outside the program

CERTIFICATION STEPS

The certification process can take up to 90 days, this can be delayed if the firm is slow in responding to requests from DSBO



*Applications will not enter the DSBO analyst queue **unless you click "submit"** **Add Small Business Certification and Contract Management System email address "**Denver@mwdbe.com**" to your email as a safe sender





DSBO verifies that a firm meets the **eligibility** to get certified not the quality of work.





- Sole proprietorship, corporation, limited liability company, partnership, limited partnership, limited liability limited partnership, etc.
- Properly licensed or registered
- Authorized to do business in the State of Colorado





Local Size Standards

- Full <u>SBA Size Standard</u> within the <u>NAICS Category</u>
- 5 years of averaged annual gross receipts (including affiliates)

DBE Size Standards

- <u>SBA Size Standard</u> within the <u>NAICS Category</u>
- Overall gross receipt cap of \$30.40M
- Utilizes both 3 & 5 years of averaged annual gross





All

 Citizen or lawful permanent resident of the United States

MWBE & DBE

 At least 51% owned and controlled by one or more socially and economically disadvantaged individuals

EBE & SBE

 At least 51% owned and controlled by one or more economically disadvantaged individuals



ITEMS NEEDED

Documents to be Notarized

Accept either regularly notarized or e-notarized documents

- Affidavit of Certification (*MWBE/DBE Only)
- New Application Affidavit
- Personal New Worth Statement (PNW)
 - You must complete the web-based PNW form in the application before you can print and notarize it.

Documents example of documents

- 5 years of Tax Returns
 - Personal
 - Business Taxes
- Governing documents based on legal structure
- Proof of contribution
- Full list of documents can be found on the <u>website</u>

Personal Net Worth (PNW)

- Net value of the assets of an <u>individual</u> after total liabilities are deducted
- Individual only, not with spouse
- DSBO utilizes the Federal PNW forms for both the local and federal program

Eligibility

- Required by law
- Not required by law
- Education, Experience, Expertise, Technical Competency

Department of Regulatory Agency (DORA)

- States umbrella regulatory agency
 - Regulate 60+ industries & professions that <u>require a license</u> in the state of Colorado

WHAT | NAICS CODES

- The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is a 2 through 6-digit hierarchical classification system that is the official standard for classification of business establishments.
- Originally adopted in 1997 to replace Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) systems and are updated every 5 years
 - <u>Current Version</u>: 2022

NAICS CODES

WHY

- The Small Business Administration (SBA) uses NAICS codes to determine <u>size</u> <u>standards</u>.
 - If you want to be classified as a small business, your company's NAICS codes must meet the size standards.
- NAICS Code must be on your letter to count towards participation
- Codes can determine how agencies determine participation goals.

WHO

- DSBO certifies firms based on the work that they **self-perform**, this work is identified using the six-digit NAICS code and CIE.
- Firms are requested to pick the corresponding index entry (CIE) most specific to the work that they **self-perform**
 - May select multiple codes
 - Select all corresponding index entries that are applicable.
 - Non-Wish list, firms must be actively performing activity.
- Prime companies & agencies can search for firms by sorting with NAICS.



CORRESPONDING INDEX ENTRIES (CIE) | NAICS CODES

- Each 6-digit NAICS code represents a number of similar industries, or Corresponding Index Entries (CIEs)
- Within a specific NAICS Code, more industryspecific detail can be determined using CIEs
- DSBO & CDOT certifies firms based on its chosen NACIS & CIE pairings, not "umbrella" codes
- Firms can select multiple CIEs for a given code

- Go to the <u>Small Business Certification and</u> <u>Contract Management System</u> to start your application
- **Submit** a complete application
- Confirm your contact information is correct
- **Respond** quickly to questions and requests
- Add <u>Denver@mwdbe.com</u> to your safe sender list
 - Most of the communication come through the Small Business Certification and Contract Management System

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE CONTRACT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM



If you start an application, you have **90 days** to complete and <u>submit</u> that application before the system purges it and you must start over.

Get notified of bid opportunities from City and County of Denver General Services Purchasing

The Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing System (BidNet®) is an online notification system that is being utilized by multiple governmental entities. Participating entities post their bids, quotes, proposals, addendums, and awards on this one centralized system.

- <u>Vendor registration</u> is FREE; however, vendors may elect to receive automatic e-mail notification of all open solicitations matching their vendor profile for an annual fee.
- If a vendor does not select the upgraded option, it is the responsibility of the vendor to monitor the website regularly in order to be aware of business opportunities and review changes or addendums to bids, quotes, and proposals.
- Vendors who upgrade to receive email notifications, will receive opportunities matching their business goods/services provided automatically.
