BLM Update

- The Bureau of Land Management has proposed updates to oil and gas regulations that aim to allow more efficient energy production on federal lands. The new rule modernizes restrictions on "commingling"—the practice of combining production from multiple leases through a single well pad. Currently, commingling is only permitted when mineral ownership and royalty conditions are identical. The proposed changes would use modern metering technology to ensure accurate royalty distribution while reducing the number of well pads needed.

La Plata County Manager Update

- The Board of La Plata County Commissioners have hired Shawna Legarza as the new County Manager. Legarza was previously the County’s Director of Emergency Management. The initial term of the agreement is one year, with renewal by mutual written agreement.
- Compensation includes a biweekly salary of \$7,692.31 for 2026 (\$200,000 annualized), subject to periodic review and general pay adjustments.

La Plata County Land Use Code Update

- La Plata County Commissioners directed Community Development staff to amend Chapter 65 of the Land Use Code to point to Chapter 66 thresholds for major land use permitting. What that means is that if the changes are approved, Animas Valley residents will have more say when major projects come forth.

Durango Affordable Housing Update

- The City of Durango will exceed the state's requirement to add 184 affordable housing units over three years, qualifying for Proposition 123 funding. Prosperity Officer Mike French reported that 1,750 housing units are in various planning stages (27% affordable), representing an 18% inventory increase over 5-6 years.
- While the city has made progress through public-private partnerships, Urban Renewal Authorities, and fee offsets totaling \$1.1-\$1.5 million annually, the core challenge remains funding. There's a \$100,000 gap per unit between development costs

and affordable pricing, and French said housing affordability is the city's biggest obstacle to workforce retention and community sustainability.

Development Projects

- Durango’s Community Development Commission (DCDC) recommended approval of the Lightner Creek Commons Planned Development Preliminary Plan. Located at 271 Twin Buttes Avenue, this is a public/private partnership between the City of Durango, Twin Buttes, Elevation Community Land Trust, and Tributary Development. The proposed development consists of 29 units, including duplexes and townhomes, which will be sold to local workforce earning 70-120% of the Area Median Income (AMI) through a community land trust model. The project still needs approval of the Durango City Council.
- DCDC recommended approval of Parker’s Animal Rescue Variance & Conditional Use Permit at 20578 & 20778 Hwy 160 West. The permit paves the way for a kennel with accessory spaces related to operating the animal rescue including a caretaker living unit.
