

Bills on the Move

Passed Senate

[Network Pharmacy Usage for Workers Compensation](#) (A10413 Bronson/S9331 Ramos) Allows workers compensation claimants to use out of network pharmacies in certain situations. **NYIA Opposes.**

[CVA Claim Details](#) (A8635B Rosenthal/S9848 Salazar) Relaxes information requirements to bring a CVA claim in New York. **NYIA Opposes.**

[Prior Convictions of Driving While Intoxicated](#) (A1814 Levenberg/S258 Martinez) Enacts "Bryan Johnson's law"; includes prior convictions of operation of a vessel while under the influence of alcohol or drugs as prior convictions of driving while intoxicated. **NYIA Supports.**

[New York Junk Fee Prevention Act](#) (A9604A Torres/S363B Gianaris) Requires sellers to indicate the total price of a good or service including mandatory fees. **NYIA Opposes.**

[Overtaking a Bike or Pedestrian](#) (A1831 Steck/S1665 Harckham) Relates to operators of a vehicle overtaking a bicycle or pedestrian outside the city of New York. **NYIA Supports.**

[Mobile Application Cancellation](#) (A7231 Bichotte-Hermelyn/S4391 Gounardes) Requires mobile applications on cell phones, smart phones and tablets that offer a subscription service provide an option to cancel the subscription on its application and have the option posted in a clear and conspicuous format. **NYIA is seeking member feedback.**

[Discarding Financial Information](#) (A10770 Rozic/S4413A May) Requires a business to delete a consumer's financial information after cancellation of an automatic renewal or continuous service. **NYIA Opposes.**

[Ignition Interlock Devices](#) (A2703A Woerner/S2517A Cooney) Requires proof of installation, maintenance and regular use of ignition interlock devices when use of such a device is ordered by a court; extends the period of suspension and revocation of a license until such proof is provided. **NYIA Supports.**

Code Violation Repairs (A5641 Hunter/S1838 Skoufis) Creates a pilot emergency repair program to allow cities to directly address hazardous code violations where the owner has not undertaken repairs. **NYIA Supports.**

Passed Assembly

Labor Market Attachment (A8482A Bronson/S6376A Scarcella-Spanton) Prohibits insurance carriers and employers from withholding certain benefits from injured workers based on attachment to the labor market. **NYIA Opposes.**

- Reported from Senate Labor Committee and referred to Senate Finance Committee

Poised for a Vote

Short-Term Disability Benefits (A9571 Bronson/S172B Ramos) Relates to increasing short-term disability benefits and expands penalties. **NYIA Opposes.**

- Poised for a vote in the Senate
- No movement in Assembly

Accident Debris (S1172 Mattera) Requires towers to clean up any debris in the surrounding area resulting from the vehicles they are towing. **NYIA Supports.**

- Reported from Senate Consumer Protection and referred
- No Assembly corresponding bill

Recharacterization of Fraud (A3459A Lavine/S3789A Myrie) Relates to civil penalties for certain fraud or misrepresentation of a material fact with respect to a financial product or service. **NYIA Opposes.**

- Poised for a vote in the Senate
- No movement in Assembly

Lead-Safe Renovation, Repair, and Painting Act (A2749 Bronson/S6228 Bailey) Allows New York to conduct training, certification, and enforcement of home renovation, repair, and painting activities related to lead paint. **NYIA Supports.**

- Poised for a vote in the Assembly
- No movement in Senate

Reported from One Committee and Referred to New Committee

Towing and Storage (A8858A Romero/S7717A Cooney) Sets maximum rates that may be charged for the towing and subsequent storage of a motor vehicle. **NYIA Supports as a Priority Initiative.**

- Reported from Assembly Consumer Affairs and Protection Committee and referred to Assembly Codes Committee
- No movement in Senate

[Surveillance Pricing](#) (A9349A Torres) Prohibits the use of surveillance pricing. Insurance carriers are expressly excluded under the Gramm Leach Bliley Act (GLBA) exemption in the bill. **NYIA is seeking member feedback.**

- Reported from Assembly Consumer Affairs and Protection Committee and referred to Assembly Codes Committee
- No Senate corresponding bill

[E-Scooter App Disclosures](#) (A11284 Berger/S10239 Comrie) Requires electric scooter service platforms to provide clear and conspicuous warnings regarding age restrictions. **NYIA Supports.**

- Reported from Assembly Consumer Affairs and Protection Committee and referred to Assembly Codes Committee
- No movement in Senate

[Reporting Biometric Data](#) (A6031 Simon/S1422A Liu) Requires private entities in possession of biometric identifiers or biometric information to develop a written policy establishing a retention schedule and guidelines for permanently destroying biometric identifiers and biometric information. **NYIA Opposes.**

- Reported from Senate Consumer Protection Committee and referred to Senate Internet and Technology Committee
- No movement in the Assembly

[New York Health Information Privacy Act](#) (A10357 Rosenthal/S9269 Krueger) Governs companies that collect and sell personal information and limits the use and sale of that information. **NYIA Opposes.**

- Reported from Assembly Science and Technology Committee and referred to Assembly Codes Committee.
- No movement in Senate

[Disability for Extreme Hardships](#) (A3723 Bronson/S3948 Ramos) Allows certain claimants to be reclassified as permanent total disability or total industrial disability due to extreme hardship. **NYIA Opposes.**

- Reported from Senate Labor Committee and referred to Senate Finance Committee
- No movement in Assembly
