# Maryland Farm Bureau Hotline #1 Bills We're Following

HB81: Real Property - Condemnation - Compensation for Farm and Agricultural Property (Protect Maryland Farm Lands Act) Sponsored by Delegate Mangione / House Hearing: Economic Matters 1/23/25 at 1:00pm

This bill would require the fair market value of agricultural property taken in a condemnation proceeding to be valued at 350% of the highest appraisal value of the property when Eminent Domain is used.

#### Maryland Farm Bureau Position: Support

MDFB is in support of HB81 as it increases the value that land holders would be paid when agriculture is taken by condemnation.

HB278: Income Tax - Subtraction Modification - Enhanced Agricultural Management Equipment Sponsored by Delegate Bouchat / House Hearing: Ways and Means 1/23/25 at 1:00pm

This bill establishes an income tax credit for farmers purchasing innovative and enhanced agricultural management equipment as determined by Secertary of Agriculture.

### Maryland Farm Bureau Position: Support

MDFB is in support of this bill as it opens an opportunity for members to receive income tax credits on the purchasing of new and innovative equipment.

SB121 (HB8): Vehicle Laws - Noise Abatement Monitoring Systems Pilot Program

- Inspection and Extension Sponsored by Senator A. Washington / Senate Hearing: Judicial 1/22/25 at 1:00pm.

This bill allows for Noise Abatement Monitoring Systems to be utilized in willing counties similarly to speed cameras. The bill would first authorize these systems to be used under a pilot program in PG and Montgomery Counties with results of the program being delivered in 2027.

## Maryland Farm Bureau Position: Monitor

MDFB will monitor the hearings of this bill to determine the potential impacts it may have on the movement of farm equipment.

SB189: Eminent Domain – Agricultural and Conservation Easements – Prohibited Taking Sponsored by Senator Brooks / Senate Hearing: Judicial 1/23/25 at 1:00pm.

This bill would further protect land in agricultural and conservation easements by prohibiting the State or any of its instrumentalities or political subdivisions from taking that land via eminent domain.

## Maryland Farm Bureau Position: Support

MDFB is in support of this bill as it further protects agriculture land from taking via eminent domain.
