Founded in 1949 by local artists, the Fresno Art Museum has evolved from an art center into a modern and contemporary art museum that exhibits the work of national and international artists. The Museum has a rich history of collecting, presenting, and interpreting diverse and meaningful works to be preserved for future generations, focusing on providing thought-provoking interactions with artists and the creative process. A collecting institution, the Fresno Art Museum holds in its permanent collection nearly 4,000 objects, including a premier collection of works from ancient Mexico through the present era. Since 1973, the Museum has maintained continuous accreditation with the American Alliance of Museums. It proudly serves the greater Central California region.

Our current exhibitions include works by Andy Warhol, Ansel Adams, Chester Arnold, and Rafael López. This summer, the Museum will host A Queen Within: Adorned Archetypes, an exhibition exploring new femininity and storytelling in boundary-pushing fashion, along with Los Angeles artist Kim Abeles, and illustrator Raúl Colón.
























Jannése american national museum

The Japanese American National Museum (JANM) promotes understanding and appreciation of America's ethnic and cultural diversity by sharing the Japanese American experience. As the national repository of Japanese American history, JANM creates historical and arts exhibitions, educational public programs, documentaries, and innovative curriculum that illuminate the stories and the rich cultural heritage of people of Japanese ancestry in the United States.

JANM's current exhibition, Sutra and Bible: Faith and the Japanese American World War II Incarceration, explores the role that religion played in saving the exiled Japanese American community from despair. The Interactive StoryFile of Lawson lichiro Sakai is a new exhibition that gives visitors a realistic experience of engaging with World War II American veteran Lawson lichiro Sakai. The upcoming exhibition, BeHere / 1942: A New Lens on the Japanese American Incarceration, invites visitors to experience the photographic archive of the 1942 forced removal of Japanese Americans in new ways, including groundbreaking augmented reality. JANM's core exhibition, Common Ground: The Heart of Community, chronicles Japanese American history, beginning in the late 1800s and continuing through the World War II incarceration, postwar resettlement, and the redress movement.



WHAT TO SEE AT TURTLE BAY

Outdoor Forest Camp

Paul Bunyan's Forest Camp at Turtle Bay is an educational hub modeled after an old-time forest camp similar to ones all over Shasta County a hundred years ago. Main features include two age-appropriate playground areas, indoor & outdoor animal exhibits, a water feature, outdoor amphitheater, Parrot Playhouse, and more.

Tutankhamun: Wonderful Things

Explore ancient Egypt through this dazzling collection of reproductions of Tutankhamun's treasures, representing the richest archeological find of all time. Learn about life in Ancient Egypt while discovering the legacy behind the life, burial, and curse of Tutankhamun, from his origins, all the way to the exciting discovery of "The Boy King's" tomb.

Nature's Blueprints: Biomimicry in Art and Design

Art, design, and environmental science come together in this exhibition through scientific and artistic objects and interactive learning stations. Explore the forms, patterns, and processes found in the natural world that have inspired the design of everything from raincoats to skyscrapers. This approach to innovation, called biomimicry, applies naturally occurring phenomena and structures such as bird wings, beehives, and porcupine quills to design improvements that enable faster travel, safer buildings, and more precise medical equipment.
























NightLife
