
Scaffolds are for Safety

Scaffold accidents happen frequently. Faulty design and inadequate construction are sometimes involved, but, in most cases, scaffold accidents are caused by careless maintenance and improper use. Help keep your scaffolds safe by observing these simple procedures:

- Inspect scaffolds daily prior to use, particularly, guard rails, connectors, fastenings, footings, tie-ins, and bracing.
- Keep platforms closely boarded, fenced, and securely fastened.
- Do not stockpile materials on scaffolds. Remove all materials and tools at the end of the day.
- Never overload scaffolds. Pile materials being worked over ledger and bearer points to minimize platform loading.
- Do not work on scaffolds during storms or high winds, and clear platforms of all ice and snow before using. Sand wet planking to prevent slipping.
- Protect scaffolds. Do not bump or strike against scaffolds with vehicles or materials.
- Control hoisted material from ground with taglines.
- Keep platforms and area around scaffold cleared of debris, un-needed equipment, material, and other hazards that will cause you to trip or fall.
