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Medical Cannabis rules proposed

Medical Association of the State of Alabama

The Alabama Board of Medical Examiners (BME) has issued for public comment rules for physician certification to recommend cannabis to patients with qualifying medical conditions. These rules provide the framework for physician application and eligibility for a certification permit and the actual physician requirements for certification for medical cannabis use.



A summary of the rules is as follows:

1. In order for a physician to be eligible for a certification permit, the physician must hold a current unrestricted Alabama medical license, an Alabama Controlled Substance Certificate, and a DEA license.
2. The physician must be registered and have access to the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) and the Alabama Medical Cannabis Patient Registry System.
3. Physicians must complete an initial four-hour (4) CME course on medical cannabis and a two-hour (2) review course every two years.
4. The initial Certification Permit is \$300 and must be renewed annually with a fee of \$200.
5. Per the legislative statute, certifying physicians will be prohibited from having a financial interest related to the certification of a patient's qualifying medical condition (other than fees charged for medical services rendered).
6. Physicians can only certify qualifying medical conditions for which they have education and training to treat patients in their normal course of practice.
7. Physicians must follow specific documentation requirements including minimum standards for patient records, written patient

CMS finalizes regulatory changes and updates physician payment system

Each year, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issues regulations that impact the reimbursement of physicians. On Nov. 2, CMS finalized a rule updating payment policies and rates for physicians paid under the Medicare Physician Fee Schedule in 2022.

The final rule illustrates the importance of the American Academy of Neurology's regulatory advocacy efforts on behalf of neurologists and their patients.

CMS expects payments across the specialty of neurology to stay at current levels in 2022, with variations depending on the individual provider's practice. However, all specialties are also potentially facing a 3.7 percent reduction in the conversion factor used to formulate payments under the Medicare Physician Fee Schedule.

The Academy is working with physician associations from across the house of medicine to fight against these potential cuts, which recently resulted in having 247 members of the U.S. House of Representatives sign a letter urging congressional leaders to act on this issue before the end of the year.

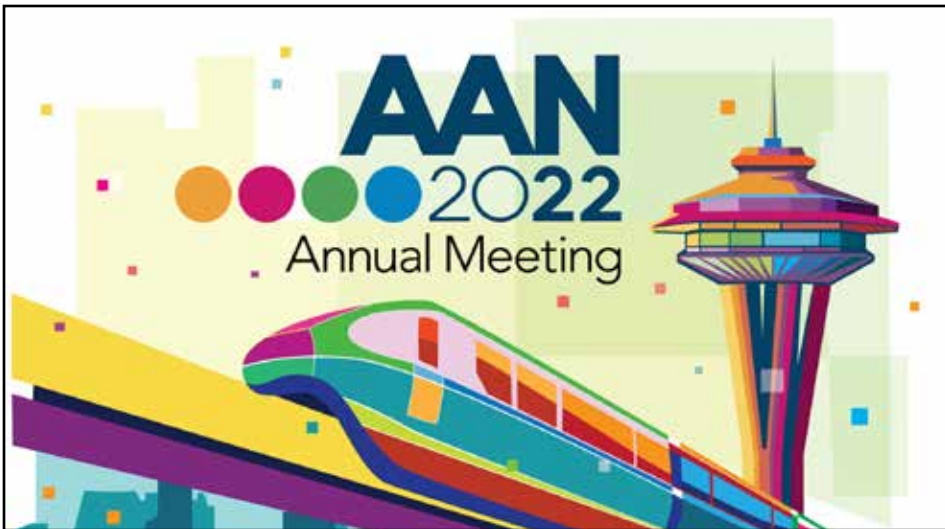

consent, and submissions to the State patient registry.

8. Certifying physicians must provide an annual report to the BME with their observations of the effectiveness of medical cannabis.

Qualifying Medical Conditions Per the Legislative Statute

- Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
- Cancer-related cachexia, nausea or vomiting, weight loss, or chronic pain
- Crohn's Disease
- Depression
- Epilepsy or a condition causing seizures
- HIV/AIDS-related nausea or weight loss
- Panic disorder

- Parkinson's disease
- Persistent nausea that is not significantly responsive to traditional treatment, except for nausea related to pregnancy, cannabis-induced cyclical vomiting syndrome, or 24 cannabinoid hyperemesis syndrome
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- Sickle Cell Anemia
- Spasticity associated with a motor neuron disease, including Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis
- Spasticity associated with Multiple Sclerosis or a spinal cord injury
- A terminal illness
- Tourette's Syndrome
- A condition causing chronic or

intractable pain in which conventional therapeutic intervention and opiate therapy is contraindicated or has proved ineffective
