DAY 1 Canada – Tokyo

DAY 2 Tokyo Arrival

Welcome to Tokyo! Upon arrival at Narita International Airport today, you will be met by our representative and assisted to board a transfer to your hotel (standard check-in time is 14:00 hrs; early check-in is subject to availability). Spend the rest of the day at leisure.

DAY 3 Tokyo

After breakfast, begin your Tokyo city tour with a visit to the peaceful oasis of Meiji Jingu Shrine. Built in 1920 to honor Emperor Meiji and Empress Shoken, this sacred site is nestled in a forested sanctuary in the heart of the city—just a short walk from the vibrant Harajuku district. Enter through the Yoyogi entrance and you'll be greeted by a towering torii gate, marking the path to the main shrine. Join the locals in offering prayers at the shrine, or explore the Meiji Jingu Museum, where a fascinating collection of imperial treasures is on display. Next, dive into Japan's culinary heritage at the Tsukiji Outer Market. Originally relocated here after the Great Kanto Earthquake of 1923, this historic market dates back to the Edo Period and is now home to over 400 tightly packed shops and eateries. Navigate the narrow alleys with your guide as you sample traditional snacks, learn about Japanese cooking ingredients, and perhaps stop at a restaurant to enjoy a fresh seafood breakfast or lunch. Step back in time with a stroll through the East Gardens of the Imperial Palace, the only part of the Imperial grounds open to the public. Once part of Edo Castle, the gardens are a tranquil blend of seasonal flowers, manicured lawns, teahouses, and historic guardhouses. Don't miss the Nijubashi Bridge, a photogenic double-arched structure originally built in wood and later reinforced with steel. (Please note: the East Gardens are closed on Mondays and Fridays.) Your final stop is Senso-ji, Tokyo's oldest and most revered Buddhist temple. Dating back to the 7th century, the temple welcomes you with the imposing Kaminarimon Gate, adorned with a massive red lantern. From there, stroll along Nakamise-dori, a 250-meter shopping street packed with stalls selling traditional souvenirs, sweets, and snacks. Pass through the Hozomon Gate to reach the main hall and the elegant five-story pagoda. Join worshippers in paying respects to the Kannon deity, draw an omikuji fortune, and collect a temple seal stamp at the nearby Yokodo hall.

DAY 4 Tokyo

Today is yours to explore this charming city at your own pace. Apart from numerous historic spots, you can step into some popular neighborhoods for a glimpse of Japanese daily life. Ramble around the Harajuku district—the center of teenage fashion and cosplay culture—or enjoy shopping at Ginza, where the streets are lined with high-end fashion boutiques, art galleries, and designer brand stores.

After breakfast, meet your local guide in the hotel lobby and set off for an unforgettable journey to Mount Fuji. Your day begins with a scenic drive to the Fuji Five Lakes region. Upon arrival, board a peaceful cruise on Lake Kawaguchi, one of the most picturesque spots to view Mount Fuji reflected on the water's surface. Next, ascend the Mt. Fuji Panoramic Ropeway to an observation deck near the summit of Mount Tenjo. From here, take in sweeping views of Lake Kawaguchi below and Mt. Fuji towering in the distance—a truly breathtaking moment. In the afternoon, head to Arakurayama Sengen Park, home to the iconic Chureito Pagoda. Framed by cherry blossoms in spring or fiery leaves in autumn, this is one of Japan's most famous photo spots with Mount Fuji rising majestically in the background. Continue your exploration with a visit to Oshino Hakkai, a charming village known for its eight crystal-clear ponds formed by the snowmelt from Mount Fuji. Wander the traditional thatched-roof homes and enjoy the peaceful atmosphere while sipping local spring water or sampling fresh snacks from nearby stalls. After a day of scenic discovery, travel onward to Hakone, a renowned hot spring resort town. Check into a traditional ryokan, where you'll have the chance to unwind in onsen (hot spring) baths and enjoy a delicious Japanese-style dinner served at your accommodation.

DAY 6 Hakone – Takayama by Train

After breakfast, begin your scenic journey to Takayama with the help of a detailed guide and map. Make your way to Odawara Station in Hakone, where you'll board the Shinkansen (bullet train) bound for Nagoya—a smooth and scenic ride of approximately 1 hour and 20 minutes. Upon arrival in Nagoya, transfer to the Limited Express train to Takayama, a charming mountain town nestled in the Japanese Alps. The ride takes around 2 hours and 50 minutes and offers breathtaking views of rivers, valleys, and forested hills along the way. Once you arrive at Takayama Station, head to your hotel at your own pace. The rest of the day is yours to relax or explore this atmospheric town at leisure.

DAY 7 Takayama

After breakfast, begin your day by immersing yourself in the local culture at Takayama's famous Morning Market. Stroll through vibrant stalls where locals sell seasonal produce, handmade crafts, and regional snacks. This is the perfect spot to observe daily life in Takayama and perhaps pick up a unique souvenir or try a local delicacy. Next, take a leisurely walk to Nakabashi Bridge, a beautifully preserved crimson bridge arching over the Miyagawa River. Especially stunning during spring, when it's surrounded by delicate cherry blossoms, this scenic spot is a photographer's dream. In the afternoon, step back in time with a visit to the Kusakabe Folk Museum, once the grand residence of a wealthy Edo-period merchant family. Wander through traditional wooden interiors and explore a fascinating collection of Hida folk crafts and ceramics that offer a glimpse into Takayama's artisanal heritage. Your day continues in Kami-Sannomachi, the heart of Takayama's beautifully preserved Old Town. This charming area is lined with historic wooden buildings, antique shops, and family-run sake breweries. As you explore the narrow streets, you'll feel like you've traveled back to the days of feudal Japan.

After a hearty breakfast, embark on a scenic one-hour drive to Shirakawa-go, a storybook village nestled in a peaceful mountain valley. Step into a world of tradition and charm, where gassho-zukuri farmhouses—with their steep, thatched roofs designed to withstand heavy snow—create a fairy-tale landscape. Begin your visit at the Wada House, one of the largest and best-preserved traditional homes in the village. Slip off your shoes and wander through the living quarters, guest room, and butsuma (Buddhist altar room) to get a sense of daily life in centuries past. Next, head to the Shirakawa-go Observation Deck for a breathtaking panoramic view of the entire village—a perfect photo opportunity to capture the full beauty of this UNESCO World Heritage Site. Before continuing on to Kanazawa, delve deeper into local life at the Gasshozukuri Minkaen Outdoor Museum, where you can explore even more historic farmhouses relocated and preserved in their original style. Learn about rural crafts, customs, and architecture as you stroll through this open-air museum.

DAY 9 Kanazawa – Kyoto

After breakfast, begin your morning with a peaceful stroll through the breathtaking Kenrokuen Garden, one of Japan's Three Great Gardens. Delight in the tranquil beauty of its elegant ponds, charming bridges, seasonal blossoms, teahouses, and meticulously arranged stones—each element carefully designed to reflect harmony and natural beauty. Just steps away, explore the 21st Century Museum of Contemporary Art, known for its innovative architecture and thought-provoking exhibits. Take your time discovering the unique installations and artwork that blend modern creativity with cultural insight. Next, step back in time with a visit to the reconstructed Kanazawa Castle, a powerful reminder of the city's samurai past. Wander the historic grounds and admire the white-plaster walls, sturdy gates, and panoramic views. After your sightseeing, your guide will drop you off at Kanazawa Station. Board the Shinkansen (bullet train) to Kyoto Station, enjoying a smooth and scenic ride to Japan's cultural heart. Upon arrival, make your way to your hotel and settle in for a restful evening.

DAY 10 Kyoto

After breakfast, set off for an unforgettable journey to Arashiyama, one of Kyoto's most scenic and culturally rich districts. Nestled on the outskirts of the city, Arashiyama offers a perfect blend of natural beauty, spiritual calm, and timeless charm. Begin your exploration at Jojakko-ji Temple, a tranquil haven perched on the hillside. Wander through its serene gardens, moss-covered paths, and rustic pagoda, all set against the gentle backdrop of the surrounding forest. This hidden gem invites quiet reflection and offers panoramic views of Kyoto below. Next, immerse yourself in the magical atmosphere of the Sagano Bamboo Grove. As you stroll along the winding path, towering stalks of bamboo rise high above you, creating a natural cathedral of green. The soft rustling of leaves and filtered sunlight make this one of Japan's most ethereal and photogenic spots. Continue your experience with a ride on a traditional Yakatabune boat, gliding gently down the Hozugawa River. From the water, take in the spectacular views of Togetsukyo Bridge, an iconic Arashiyama landmark, and enjoy a fresh perspective of the picturesque landscape. Afterward, board the Sagano Scenic Railway, a charming retro train that takes you through lush valleys and alongside dramatic river gorges. With the breeze in your face and the rhythm of the rails beneath you, this is one of the most immersive ways to enjoy Kyoto's natural countryside. As the day winds down, your guide will escort you back to Kyoto city—leaving you with lasting memories of Arashiyama's peaceful beauty and cultural depth.

After a hearty breakfast, begin your cultural adventure with a tour of Kyoto's iconic landmarks. First, visit the Kinkaku-ji Temple (Golden Pavilion), a Zen masterpiece with its top two floors entirely adorned in shimmering gold leaf. Nestled beside a reflective pond and framed by manicured gardens, it's a vision of architectural elegance and serenity. Next, head to the Fushimi Inari Taisha, one of Japan's most photographed and spiritually significant shrines. Walk through the mesmerizing pathway lined with thousands of vermilion torii gates, winding up the sacred Mount Inari—a truly unforgettable experience. In the afternoon, depart for Osaka, Japan's vibrant food and commerce hub. Your first stop will be the majestic Osaka Castle, an enduring symbol of the city's feudal past. With its striking white facade and emerald-green roofs, the castle tells tales of epic battles and the rise of the Tokugawa shogunate. Conclude your day with a visit to Shinsaibashi, Osaka's bustling shopping and entertainment district. Explore a lively mix of local boutiques, global brands, and street food stalls serving up Osaka's famous treats like takoyaki and okonomiyaki.

DAY 12 Osaka – Canada (by Flight)

This is your departure day for the standard 12-day tour. After breakfast, enjoy some time at leisure until your private driver escorts you to the airport for your flight home to Canada. (If you have booked the optional 1-night Osaka extension below, today instead becomes a full free day in Osaka, and you depart on Day 13.)

Prefer more time in Osaka? Add an extra night and a full day at leisure. Explore Dotonbori at your own pace—Osaka's famous entertainment district, known for its dazzling neon lights, the iconic Glico sign, lively atmosphere, and endless street food stalls. Or visit Osaka Castle Park and take a leisurely stroll through the beautiful gardens and walking trails surrounding Osaka Castle, offering picturesque views and a glimpse into the city's rich history.

DAY 13 Osaka – Canada (by Flight) — Optional Extension Only

This day applies only to guests who booked the optional 1-night Osaka extension; guests on the standard tour have already departed on Day 12. After breakfast, enjoy a little final free time in Osaka before your private driver escorts you to the airport for your flight home to Canada.
