Mystic is a village shared by two towns. The Mystic River Bascule Bridge divides the village—on the east side of the bridge, you're in **Stonington**. On the west side, you're in **Groton**.



A PROUD MARITIME HERITAGE.

Beginning in 1784, more than 600 ships were built here over the next 135 years, making Mystic River one of America's most important shipbuilding ports. Today, Mystic is still a haven for marine museum in the United States, preserves that rich heritage and is home to historic vessels, including the famous whale ship **Charles W. Morgan**, the last wooden whaleship in the world.



A NAME ROOTED IN NATURE.

The name "Mystic" comes from the Pequot word *miss-tuk*, meaning "a large river whose waters are driven into waves by tides or wind." a fitting description of the beautiful river that continues to define our community.
