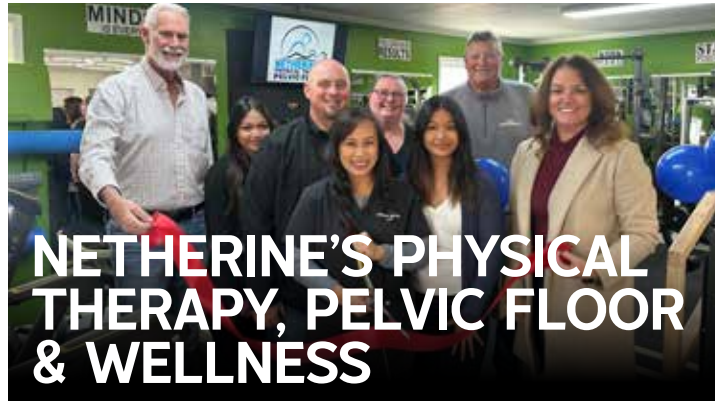

ACTIVE SHOOTER & FIRST AID SEMINAR

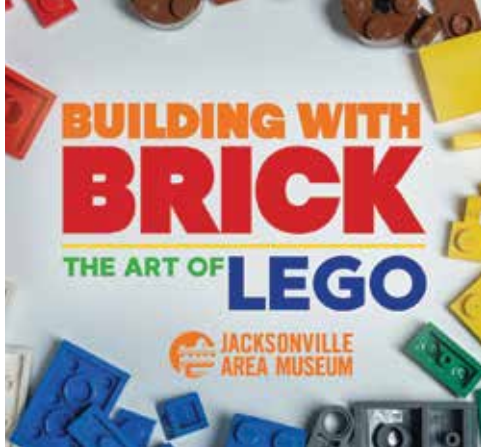

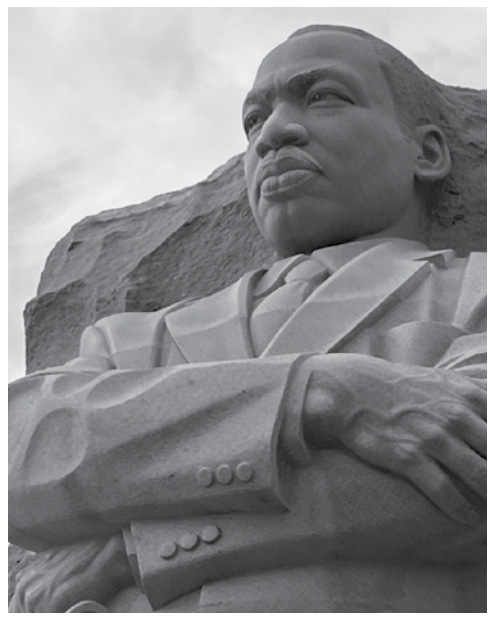
LEGO EXHIBIT AT MUSEUM THRU FEB

The Jacksonville Area Museum's annual "Building with Brick - The Art of LEGO" exhibit featuring more than 120 entries is open, and runs through February 28, 2026. The exhibit may be viewed during the museum's normal hours of operation

on Wednesdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., and Sundays from 1 to 4 p.m.

This fourth-annual exhibit features original and LEGO kit creations from all ages. Prizes based on public voting will be awarded in five categories: Kit Build for all ages, Jacksonville 200th (to commemorate the city's bicentennial) for all ages, Original Build ages 13 and up, Original Build ages 8 - 12, and Original Build ages 0 - 7.

HEALTH INSURANCE NAVIGATORS

Cass County Health Department has Health Insurance Navigators to help with Medicaid and Marketplace applications and renewals. The service is completely free. You do not have to reside in Cass County to use the service. Open Enrollment for Marketplace ends January 15. Illinois is using Get Covered Illinois this year.

If you have a Marketplace plan through Healthcare.gov, you may be automatically re-enrolled in an Illinois exchange plan. Log in to review your plan and make sure it meets your healthcare needs. Visit casscohealth.org or contact 217-323-2242, for more information.

USDA LENDER LOAN GUARANTEE

The United State Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development offers loan guarantees to help businesses access affordable financing through a lender of their choice. The Business and Industry Guaranteed Loan Program provides lenders with a risk management tool for commercial loans. The purpose of the program is to create or retain jobs in rural communities and improve their economic climate.

Some of the benefits of the program include long term fixed or variable interest rates, extended repayment terms, low guarantee fees, and local program delivery.

Eligible borrowers are individuals, corporations, cooperatives, partnerships, and other legal entities that are organized and operated on a profit or nonprofit basis. Loans can be used for activities such as acquisition, expansion,

construction, equipment, working capital, and refinancing. Maximum loan terms are 30 years for real estate, 15 years for equipment and 7 years for working capital. There is no minimum loan amount, and the maximum loan amount is \$25 million with up to an 80% guarantee.

EXAMPLE PROJECTS:

Farm King Supply, LLC - Macomb; FY 2021-\$16,000,000

This Rural Development Guaranteed investment was used primarily to restructure debt of Farm King Supply, LLC and its co-borrowers, FKS Enterprises, Inc. (parent company) and Azelia Company, LLC (real estate holding company). Farm King Supply, LLC operates six farm/outdoors-based big box retail stores in Burlington, Iowa and the Illinois communities of Macomb, Galesburg, Kewanee, Canton, and Monmouth. They have a headquarters facility and a former store/storage facility in Macomb as

well. The refinance of existing loans removed balloon payments from the notes to be refinanced, and it resulted in a reduction to required loan payments by approximately \$370,213 per month. This financing helped to stabilize the borrowers' cash flow, which assisted them in retaining the 218 full-time equivalent jobs they provide to the rural communities in which they are located.

ProTek Communications, LLC - Marion; FY 2025- \$20,994,000

This Rural Development investment will provide financing to construct and operate new fiber-optic infrastructure covering more than 700 miles across rural Southern Illinois. The project is expected to deliver fiber-to-the-home services to more than 7,000 households in Williamson, Franklin, Jackson, Union, Johnson, and Massac counties. The remaining project costs of \$51,000,000 have been awarded through the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) Office

of Broadband. The investment will save 30 jobs.

Hillsdale Elevator Company/Compeer Financial; FY 2025 - \$9,900,000

Hillsdale Elevator Company worked with Compeer Financial, FLCA, to restructure some existing debt and acquire 8 additional grain facilities in Illinois. These 8 locations were set to close until the Hillsdale Elevator Company made the decision to purchase these sites. The loan guarantee provided long-term financing options and assisted in saving 17 jobs. (Abingdon, Alexis, Galesburg, Henderson, New Windsor, Ophiem, Viola, Orion)
