## Re: The regulation of electricity and use in Yukon

Thank you for your letter of March 26, 2022, following up on our meeting of March 1, 2022. You have raised many important items for consideration, and I appreciate the significance and value of the Chamber of Commerce and its work in advocating for the interests of Yukoners.

The Government of Yukon recently began reviewing the *Public Utilities* Act to assess whether amendments are needed to support a more efficient and modern process for regulating electricity in the territory. This follows action items set out in Our Clean Future: A Yukon strategy for climate change, energy and a green economy. As this work is in its earliest stages, the nature and extent of changes to be undertaken has not yet been determined. I have shared your concerns with the department and an official will reach out to you as part of the engagement.

Thank you again for your advocacy and work on this important issue.
