

•	EHN Intensive Outpatient Program	IOP offers participants high-quality, intensive therapy for addiction, mental health disorders and workplace trauma while maintaining commitments to work and family.
•	Hunting and Fishing Accidental Death & Dismemberment	Our unique hunting and fishing coverage provides extra coverage to ensure, no matter where you go, you're protected.
0	Travelling in Canada For Medical Purposes	This benefit provides you and your eligible dependents financial assistance for travel within Canada for medical purposes, including expenses like airfare, gas, accommodations, meals, and incidentals.
0	Chief and Council Coverage	An employee benefits plan for Executives who are paid an honorarium and do not qualify for benefits under your current program.
0	Community Member Benefits Plan	You can provide health and wellness support, similar to an employee plan, but for your entire community. It's an equitable way to support members with their health and dental needs.
•	Elder Benefits Plan	Protect elders in your community with health and wellness support similar to an employee plan.
0	Children's Benefits Program	A program designed to provide health and dental benefits for youth under the care of a First Nations or Inuit child and family services agency in Canada.
•	Homewood	Homewood Health is an EAP program that delivers a continuum of mental health and addiction services, including counselling by elders, healers and knowledge keepers.
	Manager Assistance Program	A program designed to help managers get personalized assistance, and to support employees by referring them to professional help.
