Waupaca County Catch-a-Ride

Catch-a-Ride

Overview: The transportation solution developed by the community leadership in Waupaca County takes an innovative, yet proven approach to addressing rural transportation through a Mobility as a Service (MaaS) and Mobility Management model - the practice of coordination, using all available resources, and developing new ones to improve mobility, increase efficiency and reduce cost.

As recovery from the COVID crisis continues, the services ensure that community members facing economic insecurity, returning to employment, or endeavoring to maintain employment have affordable transportation available.

Waupaca County Catch-a-Ride provides county residents a call center and web/mobile apps for employees and employers to arrange for transportation 24/7, as well as community members as additional capacity allows. A variety of different transportation options are available including 1) Feonix Micro-Transit Service, 2) Feonix volunteer drivers; 3) public transit. In total, Waupaca County Catch-a-Ride has provided more than 5,000 rides in the first year alone.

Project Need: In New London and surrounding rural areas, the percentage of households with fewer vehicles than workers ranged from 7.9% to 13.1%. In the Waupaca and Clintonville areas, it's just over 11%. Compared to the rural areas of Winnebago and Outagamie Counties - Waupaca County's largest workforce trade partners - the numbers are as low as 1.3%. In addition, Hispanic households, have been disproportionately harmed by the economic fallout of COVID-19. According to the Bureau for Labor Statistics, they accounted for 23% of the initial job loss due to the pandemic while making up only 16% of the civilian noninstitutional population. There are 258 unique employers who recruit staff members located in Waupaca County. Over 25% of adults in Waupaca County are considered low-income (below 185% of the Federal poverty level).

Community Partners: Across the county, over 20 organizations – both public and private, come together on a quarterly basis with the Mobility Leadership Circle to address and advise the program development and deployment. This collaboration and shared commitment demonstrates both the need as well as the shared vision of support and success for the county's residents.
