Manufacturing Dinner

Manufacturing has been and continues to be a primary contributor to the success of the Sauk Valley Area. The Chamber held its first Annual Manufacturing Dinner in May at Sauk Valley Community College to recognize and celebrate the manufacturing industry. The collaboration being done between The Chamber, our members, manufacturing and education (Sauk Valley Community College, Morrison Institute of Technology, and the Whiteside Area Career Center) to address workforce development and improve career pathways is critical to the growth of the Sauk Valley. 160 guest attended this inaugural event.





Collaboration and Partnerships-Working with the SBDC at SVCC and Sterling Main Street we worked to promote small businesses, shopping local and using local resources to support our members and strengthen the Sauk Valley. We continued working with the Greater Sterling Development Corporation, Sterling Today, The City of Sterling, The City of Rock Falls, and Rock Falls Tourism to provide support in the areas of Economic Development and Toursim.

Community Leadership- Throughout 2018 we continued to be engaged in the Sauk Valley Leadership program; the 2018-19 class includes 14 participants representing all areas off the Sauk Valley.

Critical Conversations- Recruiting and Retaining people to our community was a big topic for 2018. A workshop on this topic including a panel of Millennials' prompted the realization that more conversations and sharing of ideas needed to be done with this demographic. Partnering with Sterling Main Street we have begun a series of meetings to engage the Millenials' in the Sauk Valley and to develop strategies to help keep this area thriving.

Legislative Advocacy-Throughout the year, the chamber worked with State Representatives to ensure that our members voices were heard regarding issues important to them at the state level. In September a Candidate Forum was held for local candidates with over 100 people attending. The Chamber continued to work with city officials to advocate for the business community.

Workforce Development- Through our involvement in the Inspire MORE initative, the CEO program, the MutliCraft program, the SVCC Ag Advisory Board and our Education committee, we continue to be committed to developing creative ways to create talent pipelines, create bridges between education and empolyers/business, and impact change for our future workforce.
