Agribusiness Committee

The Agribusiness committee is one of the chambers longest standing committees; with over 35 years of supporting the Agribusiness community in the Sauk Valley. In 2019 the Steak Fry in the Country served over 300 people and raised over \$14,000 to support Ag Education. Members of the Agribusiness committee also serve on the Sauk Valley Community College Ag Advisory Board.

Education Committee

This committee continues to grow in members, as it provides a platform for Workforce Development Initiatives. Our members to make connections and develop strategies and action plans to bridge the gap between education and employment while providing real life experiences for career pathways exploration. This committee developed an Essential Skills Training that was piloted in fall 2019. Six businesses participated in the workshop and worked with high school students engaging in discussion and activities about the essential (soft skills) needed in the workforce. Through our involvement in the 60x25/Inspire MORE initiative, the CEO program, the MEIP MutliCraft program, and ROE #47 we continue to be committed to developing creative ways to create talent pipelines, create bridges between education and employers/business, and impact change for our future workforce. Through various collaborative projects, Chamber businesses and organizations gained exposure through providing tours, participating in discussions, and providing information on current workforce needs with local educators.


Manufacturing Dinner

Collaboration and Partnerships- It is through building relationships that communities will impact change. We exist to be the voice for your business/organization and worked on your behalf to be part of conversations relevant to business growth and issues impacting the Sauk Valley. Some of our local partners include Sterling Main Street, Greater Sterling Development Corporation, Sterling Today, The City of Sterling, The City of Rock Falls, Whiteside County Economic Development, Rock Falls Tourism, Sauk Valley Community College, Morrison Institute of Technology, Sterling Public Schools, Rock Falls School District 13, Newman Central Catholic Hish School, and CGH.

Community Leadership- Throughout 2019 we continued to be engaged in the Sauk Valley Leadership program; the 2019-2020 class includes 18 participants representing all areas off the Sauk Valley. This program is a collaborative effort with SVCC, Dixon Chamber of Commerce and Main Street and the Rock Falls Chamber of Commerce.

Critical Conversations...Taking Action In 2018, partnering with Sterling Main Street, we worked to engage Millennials in conversations about how to keep the Sauk Valley vibrant and moving forward. In 2019 this group continued to meet and share ideas, discuss solutions, and take action to impact change. Several members formed a subcommittee and moved forward to bring a dog park to town. working with Sterling Park District; Dogwood Acres will be a great addition to the community. With a name change - now the **Keystone Group**- this group moves into 2020 with commitment, passion, and energy to partner with community leaders to address community issues!

Legislative Advocacy-. This year we worked diligently to keep our members informed and engaged in legislative issues as the state, local, and national level. There were many legislative issues to be addressed and through our collaboration with the Illinois Chamber of Commerce, the United States Chamber of Commerce, and our local, state, and national legislators we provided opportunities for our members to learn and to share about legislative issues of concern to them. Several legislative update workshops were held throughout the year and Representative McCombie participated in a downtown walking tour to visit with downtown merchants.
