## A Message from the Director

The spring session of the Illinois General Assembly concluded in the early morning hours of Saturday, April 9. The Chambers All In for Economic Recovery Coalition stayed keyed into the activity around our platform throughout the session. This note shares an update and celebrates our successes on each platform item. The SVACC is proud to be part of this coalition to continue to be a voice for you, our members!

- **Platform Item:** Utilize American Rescue Plan Act funding to help replenish the unemployment trust fund and alleviate the impending financial drain from the state's businesses.
  - A new law was passed and signed to put \$2.7 billion dollars from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) monies into the \$4.5 billion Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund deficit. Chambers All In repeatedly shared with legislators the importance of this action for the business community's recovery. Replenishing this fund remained our highest priority this session. While we advocated for the entirety of the remaining ARPA funds to be used for this purpose, we recognize that this \$2.7 billion infusion is a critical step toward reducing the burden on the business community.
  - This action is coupled with legislation (SB157) to extend the deadline that would trigger higher taxes and reduced benefits for the unemployed. Should the amendment be signed into law by Governor Pritzker, the deadline would be moved from July 3, 2022 to January 1, 2023, allowing additional time for negotiation on behalf of the business community.
- **Platform Item:** Provide legal protections to employers who follow the CDC established safety guidelines from claims that COVID-19 was contracted at the place of business.
  - While this item failed to gain traction, we remain steadfast in our call that business owners must be protected.
- **Platform Item:** Restructure the Minimum Wage Credit's incremental phase-out to allow small businesses to capture the original intent of the credit.
  - The coalition is proud that we got HB 5320 introduced in this session. The legislation would have allowed the state's small businesses to take advantage of more significant credit amounts through the credit's phase-out in 2025. We secured 16 sponsors for the legislation through our advocacy work and brought it to a subject matter hearing in committee. While our coalition was optimistic that the bill would get incorporated into a larger package, unfortunately, this did not materialize. This past session has set a foundation to continue work on this issue.
- **Platform Item:** Extend the EDGE credit sunset clause out for another ten years and utilize the tax credit as an incentive to attract new businesses to the state and allow for the growth and development of existing companies.
  - Illinois' economic development tool is the EDGE credit. This call was a part of the Chambers All In platform, as retaining the program allows Illinois to remain competitive against other states. We are grateful that Gov. Pritzker acknowledged the need to renew this credit in his February budget address. We are pleased the General Assembly agreed and extended the program for another five years (SB157).

Chambers All In for Economic Recovery is proud to advocate for our members with our peer chambers from across the state. We recognize that advocacy is a process and we look forward to continued work to better the state's business community in the weeks to come.







#### **Guest Editorial**

Sterling Main Street has set some big hairy audacious goals for 2022 and beyond. Along with our usual line up of community activities and events, we are embarking on two long lasting projects that we'd like to share with you: the creation of a retail incubator space, and the restoration of our historic murals.



#### THE SHOPPES AT GRANDON PLAZA

Inspired by the success of retail incubator programs such as the Batavia Boardwalk Shops (Batavia, IL) and Western Market (Muskegon, MI), and building upon existing community assets such as the year-round Twin City Farmers Market and the Kitchen Incubator of NW Illinois that support local entrepreneurship, The Shoppes at Grandon Plaza will offer an opportunity for local entrepreneurs to test the market and hone the



skills necessary to succeed in today's competitive retail market. Running a business is a big venture and Sterling Main Street wants project participants to succeed. Whether it's an existing home-based or online business looking to grow, or a prospect just getting started, this incubator program will offer ongoing support and training in conjunction with Sterling Main Street, the Illinois Small Business Development Center at Sauk Valley Community College and other community partners. Our goal at the end of the 8-month incubation period is that vendors will be confident in taking the next step into a permanent brick & mortar location, be it downtown Sterling or elsewhere in the Sauk Valley region.

Thanks to the generous contribution of the site (vacant lot at 310 2nd Ave, Sterling) by Sterling Today, Inc. and an initial investment by the City of Sterling, construction will begin in the Summer of 2022. Additional partners have already committed their time and talent to the project, including McCloud & Associates Architecture, Wendler Engineering, and the Building Trades Program of the Whiteside Area Career Center, along with the countless hours of time the volunteers of Sterling Main Street's Economic Vitality Committee have dedicated to this project.

The long-term goal of this project is to continue to foster entrepreneurship in Sterling and the greater Sauk Valley region, specifically as it relates to retail shopping. To provide a structured setting for new businesses to test their market, while also providing the ongoing educational support and training for those entrepreneurs to help ensure their best chance of long-term success in a competitive and challenging retail environment. And further, to provide a pipeline of new businesses to keep storefronts occupied and add to the prosperity of the communities in which they locate.

#### How you can help....

Sterling Main Street is seeking community partners to invest in entrepreneurship in Sterling and the greater Sauk Valley area. Your one-time contribution to this project will help curate small businesses in our community for years to come.

Your investment will assist with construction costs of the incubator units, including the needed sitework. We are hopeful investor response will be great enough that we are able to fully complete the space with landscaping and other amenities to make the Shoppes at Grandon Plaza a destination in Downtown Sterling, complement the improvements the City is making to Central Memorial Park, and provide a pedestrian connection from the park to the rest of the Downtown. We are grateful to those who have already committed their services to bringing this project to life, and the opportunity to work with the next generation of entrepreneurs in its construction through our partnership with the Building Trades Program of the Whiteside Area Career Center (WACC).

Sterling has a long history of innovation and creativity. The addition of a retail-focused incubator will complement existing assets such as the Small Business Technology Center, the Kitchen Incubator of NW Illinois and the Twin City Farmers Market to further Sterling's legacy as the hub of entrepreneurship in the Sauk Valley. With the continued growth of local programs such as WACC's Creating Entrepreneurial (CEO) Program and the Sauk Valley Community Leadership Program, along with local events like Sterling Main Street's Pop-Up Market, the Shoppes at Grandon Plaza will continue to expand the pipeline of services our community can offer to continue to "grow our own" small businesses.

#### **MURAL RESTORATION**

Thanks to new energy from our Keystone Group, a revamped Mural Committee formed in late 2021. After a thorough inspection of the murals, the group began prioritizing their maintenance needs. "Adelante" (1999) by Muralist Roberto Valadez was selected as the first to focus our efforts on. The group is planning for the

restoration of this mural depicting Sterling's rich Hispanic heritage over two- week's time in August 2022, for an unveiling in conjunction with the 2022 Fiesta Days Parade. The original muralist, Roberto Valadez, will be returning to Sterling to take part in its restoration and we will be enlisting additional assistance from the community.

While a few of the murals are in need of more significant repairs, many of them are just in need of a little cleaning and new layer of protective coating to preserve them for years to come. These tasks will be ongoing throughout the year as well, as planning and fundraising efforts take place to address some of the more detailed repairs needed to others.
