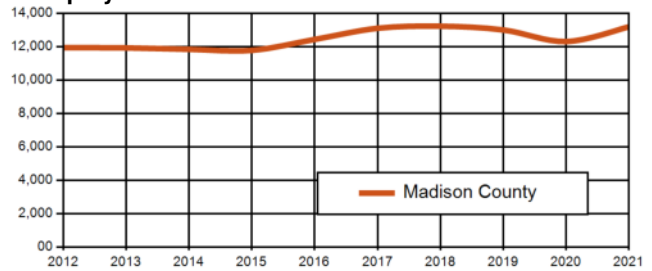

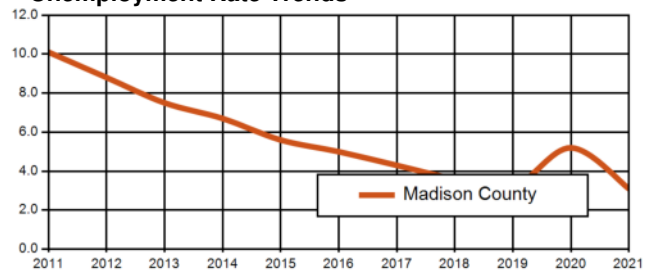

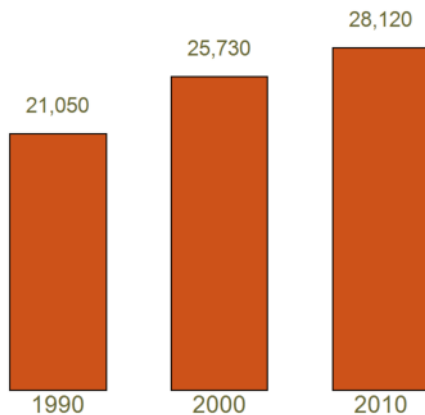
Employment Trends

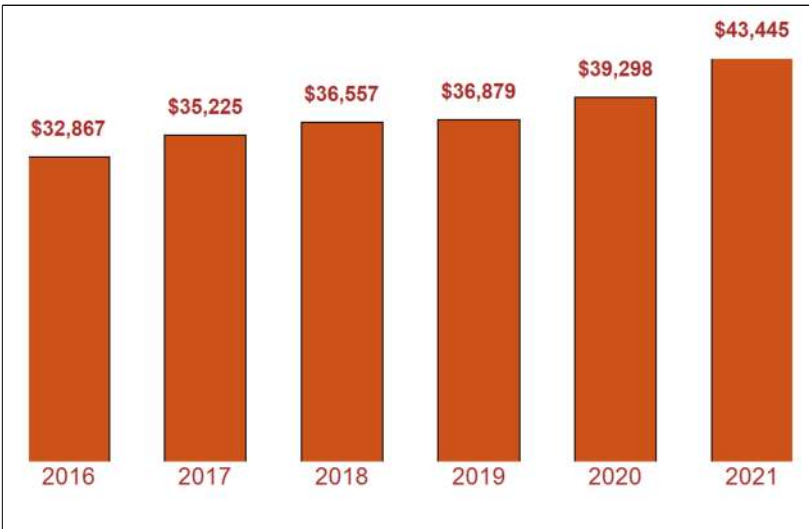

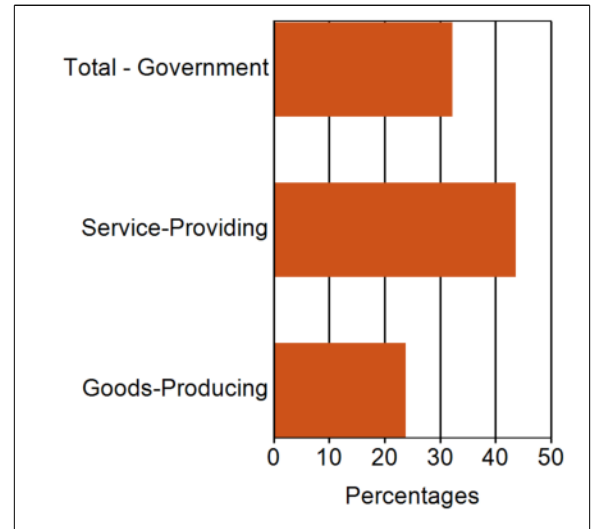
## Madison Per Capita Income
