Purpose of Leadership Lodi

Since its beginning in 1990, Leadership Lodi has been designed to inspire and motivate Lodi area citizens to achieve higher levels of leadership responsibility. The ten -month program provides participants with the necessary information to understand the complexities of the Lodi community. In addition, the program will provide students with the opportunity to meet and exchange ideas with current community leaders. Participants will discuss, explore, and learn about topics such as leadership dynamics, government, education, law, agribusiness, economic development t, health, and the arts.

Who Should Apply?

Leadership Lodi applicants should be seeking to enhance their leadership potential, increase their knowledge of the community, and be willing to commit their individual talents for future years for the betterment of the community of Lodi. Graduates of the program include individuals from a wide cross-section of the Lodi community, including representatives from both large and small businesses.

Commitment

Participants attend ten full-day class sessions held on the second Tuesday of each month. Additionally, class members must participate in the class project selected at a mandatory two-day retreat and attend three community meetings. In order to graduate from the program, no more than two class days may be missed and "made up". Partial day attendance, including late arrival, counts as an absence.

Tuition

Leadership Lodi is an educational program sponsored by the Lodi District Chamber of Commerce, a non-profit organization. Tuition for Leadership Lodi is \$1,000 per student. Please note, a \$100 down-payment must accompany the application and \$900 which is due at the start of the first class in February. The tuition may be paid by the participant, by the employer, or through a sponsor. The Lodi District Chamber of Commerce accepts payment via check, Visa, and MasterCard. Down-payments of individuals who are not selected will be fully refunded. Tuition is a tax- deductible education expense.

Selection of Participants

The Leadership Lodi Steering Committee is charged with selecting a diverse group for each yearly class. Membership or past involvement with the Lodi District Chamber of Commerce does not ensure acceptance in the program.

Application Deadline

The application deadline for enrollment is the first Friday in December. Appointments for personal interviews will be made throughout December, with class selection made at the end of the year.

To ensure your enrollment, please complete your application and submit it along with your down-payment as soon as possible. Only a limited number of participants, approximately 14, are accepted each year.

Graduation from this program requires the following participation and commitments. Please mark your initia	ls on
the spaces below indicating your understanding and agreement.	
Class sessions are scheduled from 7:45 am until 5:00 pm on the second Tuesday of each month fro	m
February through (and including) November. Participants may only miss a maximum of two full-	day
sessions. If any day (or part of a day) is missed, the participant must attend a community meeting	(from
list of approved meetings) and submit a written review.	
In addition to any required make-up sessions, participants must attend three (3) community meeting	ngs or
volunteer at six (6) opportunities. These can be done at any time during the year.	
Time to return phone calls will be allotted during short breaks and lunch. Participants are not to use the	eir
mobile devices during class, and may not leave the premises at any time.	
Each participant must attend and contribute to the mandatory retreat in March. This event will be	e spent
planning your class project . This retreat is only for participants (no spouses, children, etc).	
Volunteer time is required to plan for - and complete - the selected class project, often in evenings a	ınd
weekends. Participants can expect to spend 10-30 hours completing the project.	
To avoid conflicts of interest, participants understand that any non-pro fit organizations in which	they
serve in a leadership role will not be considered for the class project.	
Participants must have their employers' approval to join Leadership Lodi, including the commitme	ent and
participation it requires which often conflicts with work schedules. This includes class sessions, the	e
retreat, volunteering towards the class project, and any other meetings and commitments that may	arise.
While attending sessions and working on the class project, participants are expected to represent t	the
Leadership Lodi program with the utmost of professionalism and respect toward others.	
Prior to a successful graduation from the program, participants shall have identified an area of vol	unteer
community service, and shall have offered their ongoing commitment to that organization.
