REPRESENTATIVE BEN FREDERICK RECEIVES MICHIGAN ECONOMIC DEVELOPERS ASSOCIATION LEGISLATIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CHAMPION AWARD; BECOMES FIRST TWO-TIME RECIPIENT

Lansing, Michigan – March 21, 2022 – State Representative Ben Frederick (R-Owosso) is recognized as a 2022 Legislative Economic Development Champion (LEDC) by the Michigan Economic Developers Association (MEDA). The award was presented to him on March 3rd during the Association’s Capitol Day event at the Lansing Center in Lansing, Michigan. This is his second LEDC Award as he was also recognized in 2020.

MEDA is a professional society with members throughout the state that attract and grow business, create, and retain jobs, and make our communities a better place to live. The Awards were developed in 2020 by the Association to recognize legislators that show a passion for championing economic development work by assisting economic development efforts that affect the entire state, assisting with local economic development projects, championing support for funding related to economic development programs and services, participating with their local economic development organization, or sponsoring economic development legislation. Seven other legislators from Michigan’s House of Representatives and Senate were awarded in 2022.

Representative Frederick’s nomination from MEDA’s Advocacy Committee came from his sponsorship of House Bill 5602, 5603, and 5604, all of which provided new tools that economic developers can use to attract and grow business and jobs in Michigan. These were a part of a package of bills that helped to create the Critical Industry Program (CIP) and the Strategic Site Readiness (SSRP) program as well as the fund that supports them, the Strategic Outreach and Attraction Reserve (SOAR) Fund, in the amount of \$1billion. These bills were welcomed by the economic development community in Michigan to help in the State’s continued recovery following the pandemic.

We look forward to Representative Frederick’s continued leadership in championing economic development policy for Michigan.
