# Cincinnati: A City of Immigrants



The foundation works through community leaders to identify children who wish to attend summer camps but do not have the financial means to do so. We work with families to complete camp applications, secure required physical check-ups exams, and take care of other incidentals related to camp attendance, including transportation to camps if needed. Grants and donations are used to cover the cost of camp attendance for these children.

Using the City of Immigrants booklet as a informational tool, we work in partnership with educators in the community to deliver this anti-bullying program. This program is designed to increase overall awareness of diversity in our community, including racial-ethnicity, learning styles and physical diversity (weight, height, disabilities, etc.). This program provides information on the various waves of immigrants that have come to Cincinnati.

In partnership with Santa Maria Community Services, we provide programs for women who are in a home/relationship where they are experiencing some level of violence. Twenty women participated in this program during a year and they learned about domestic violence. Out of this program, we have developed a violence indicator, a business card sized educational tool that educates individuals on violent behaviors and their progression. We are currently working with community groups to distribute this simple and powerful tool in high schools and local colleges.

## Cincy-Cinco Latino Festival

## College Scholarships



High performing Hispanic college students are eligible to apply for a scholarship through the Foundation. These scholarships typically range from between \$ 1,000 and \$ 5,000. These scholarships are granted to **local** Hispanic students attending our **local** Universities. Scholarships are funded through the generosity of individuals and businesses in our community. Many of the students who receive the scholarships are **first** generation college students!

## Hispanic Volunteer Day



Every year, the second Saturday in October, we gather a large group of volunteers (150+ including approx. 30% children) together to make a difference in the community of **Price Hill**. Volunteers age five and over are welcome to help with a wide range of projects from painting, cutting grass, landscaping, cleaning parks, putting together multi-lingual literacy kits to beautifying the neighborhood.

## **Price Hill Champions**



An after school program for boys and girls students at Robert's Academy that supports socialization, character building, healthy life styles, and drugs prevention. It provides positive adult role models and safe after school activities. This program meets in spring and fall sessions and includes soccer play time, an anti-drug education component (Smoking, vaping, Marijuana usage), and information on healthy lifestyles including nutrition and exercise. Character building and positive overall wellbeing is emphasized. A closing ceremony with parents tops off the program, with student participation/successes recognized. The students love this program!
