What is Youth Apprenticeship?


- Students:

 - work for an employer at a paid position in the same field.
 - receive credit for the job as if it were an elective course (1.0 credit).





What are the requirements for Youth Apprenticeship?

- Students must:
 - maintain high attendance

 in both school and the
 apprenticeship position.
 Number of days a student
 can miss depends on the
 specific employer, but
 expectations are high for all.
 - complete two related courses before or during the program per apprenticeship year.
 - work a minimum of 450 hours per apprenticeship year.
 - at the end of the program, show proficiency in skills related to the field.
 - participate in industry-specific training requirements such as OSHA or CNA.
