
Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

Bill Highlights

- \$1.2 trillion total: Includes \$550 billion in new spending over five years, without raising taxes.
- Alaska is estimated receive \sim \$5 billion, the most *per capita* than any other state.
- Provides investments for core infrastructure: roads, bridges, rail, transit, ferries, ports, airports, energy, water systems, and broadband.
- Authored and negotiated by Senator Murkowski and bipartisan group of 10 Senators.
- Will grow America's and Alaska's economy, create jobs, and push against inflation.


