Abbotsford, BC – The Abbotsford Chamber of Commerce alongside the BC Chamber of Commerce and other lower mainland chambers was a strong voice on the importance of addressing future flooding risks and strategic management of the lower Fraser River. The BC Caucus stressed the importance of the matter as an issue of national significance in securing food security, trade and transportation connectivity across the nation and from Canada's Pacific Gateway port, road and rail infrastructure.

The Abbotsford Chamber of Commerce also gave voice to the many private childcare operators who must be part of the country and provinces' plans on affordable childcare. The Abbotsford Chamber spoke of the importance of business autonomy and the elimination of unnecessary regulations on the private sector. The overall competitiveness for the private sector is key to enabling quality day care. The Abbotsford Chamber stressed that government support should be targeted and maximized for families that need it the most. The need for more Early Childhood Educators to support people and families across British Columbia was also raised in the submission lead by the Victoria Chamber of Commerce.

"I am always amazed by the strong voice of Chambers that come together

from across the nation to participate in the Canadian Chamber Conference. There were very meaningful policy resolutions debated this year and those at the crux of some of the key challenges business are grappling with and will be in the coming year ahead," said Katerina Anastasiadis, CEO of the Abbotsford Chamber of Commerce, "I am pleased with the strong representation the BC Caucus and Fraser Valley Chambers had to ensure our local policy positions with a national impact were heard and supported."

The Canadian Chamber of Commerce AGM & Policy Convention took place October 14-15th in Ottawa with delegates and stakeholders from across the country. Notable discussions included, "A Conversation with the United States Ambassador to Canada His Excellency David Cohen and the Hon. Perrin Beatty."
