The Year in Review for the Abbotsford Chamber of Commerce

As 2024 draws to a close, the Abbotsford Chamber of Commerce celebrates a year of progress, innovation, and connection. This year brought pivotal milestones, groundbreaking initiatives, and meaningful moments that solidified our commitment to supporting businesses and driving economic growth in Abbotsford.

Advocate: Championing Regional Progress

Advocacy was at the forefront of our efforts in 2024, with the Chamber making significant strides in shaping policies and fostering regional collaboration.

This spring, Chambers of the Fraser Valley came together to form the Fraser Valley Business Coalition to be a united voice on behalf of the region's business communities. In May, the coalition hosted the inaugural Fraser Valley Economic Summit, an event to deliver a bold economic vision for the region. The summit brought together policymakers like municipal leaders, Premier David Eby, and industry leaders to discuss pressing economic issues in the Fraser Valley and chart a course for sustainable growth. With thoughtprovoking panels and actionable insights, the summit emphasized the importance of unified regional strategies to address evolving challenges.

Bringing local issues to a provincial platform, the Abbotsford Chamber brought forth two policy resolutions that were passed by the BC Chamber in May. These policies advocate for an increase in post-secondary funding for student

seats based on regional population growth and for the reallocation of lowquality agricultural land out of the ALR for Agri-industrial use. These policies were written in collaboration with key stakeholders in Abbotsford and were a reflection of the needs of our members.

The Leader's Lunch Series furthered these efforts by giving attendees the opportunity to engage directly with decision-makers and key-thinkers, featuring prominent speakers like Chief Constable Watson in February, our Annual General Meeting in March, and the Fraser Valley Economic Forecast with Ken Peacock in October.

Benefit: Empowering Members with Accessible Resources

This year, the Chamber focused on enhancing value for our members by making resources more accessible and impactful.

The decision to make Business After Business networking events free for members was a testament to our commitment to reducing barriers to meaningful connections. With vibrant gatherings hosted monthly at venues like Fraser River Funeral Home, Midland Appliance, and UFV, these events fostered new partnerships and deepened community ties.

In addition, our New Member Orientations in March and September helped newcomers navigate Chamber benefits and find their place in the network.

The launch of the Women's Leadership Council (WLC) in September was another milestone that marked a

new chapter in empowering female professionals and fostering leadership excellence. The WLC has already begun driving meaningful conversations about equity, mentorship, and change-making within the business community.

Connect: Building Bridges Across Sectors

The Agricultural Bus Tour in June and the Manufacturing Bus Tour in October offered unique opportunities to explore Abbotsford's under-appreciated economic backbone. These tours connected participants with key industry players and showcased the innovation driving local businesses forward.

Keystone events like the recent **Business Excellence Awards Ceremony** on November 14th brought the community together in celebration, underscoring the strength and vibrancy of our local business ecosystem.
