"As an agriculture and manufacturing powerhouse, the economic success of Abbotsford businesses is key to success of the province as a whole," said Alex Mitchell, CEO of the Abbotsford Chamber of Commerce. "Events like these drive momentum on the issues that matter most to our local economy." Minister Gibson emphasized the importance of resilient, regionally focused economic development and shared updates on how the government is investing in local industries to ensure long-term growth and job creation as B.C. businesses navigate

For example, the province has committed \$2,075,000.00 to support the expansion of Abbotsford's manufacturing sector. The largest allocation of this funding, amounting to \$1.1 million, was awarded to Columbia Kitchen Cabinets to purchase new automated equipment, expand their facility, and introduce four new product lines. This investment is expected to create 48 new jobs and strengthen the region's position as a hub for custom cabinetry and kitchen product manufacturing. (Abby News)
